It's been 70 years since radio announcer Norman Banks sowed the seeds for an event that is now an integral part of Christmas in Australia. Vision Australia's Carols by Candlelight is something we are immensely proud to present as it very much reflects our philosophy.

We combine the resources and talents of people who are blind, sighted or have low vision to make a difference to the lives of thousands of Australians. We also advise parents so they are equipped to give the child the best possible start in life.

Christmas in the Law's Geelong home is always an exciting time. For 10-year-old Jacob, Kate, aged eight, and five-year-old Nicholas, the celebrations start on Christmas Eve when the family tunes into the television broadcast of Vision Australia's Carols by Candlelight.

This year will be extra special as the children and their parents, Jayne and David, will be attending the show at the Sidney Myer Music Bowl for the first time.

Jacob, Kate, Nicholas and their mum will experience the big night a little differently to most audience members. This is because Jayne and her children are legally blind due to aniridia, which affects iris development. Because they can't control the amount of light that enters their eyes they are unable to see far. The children also have nystagmus, which causes involuntary eye movements.

Yet their limited sight does not stop them from doing the same things as their friends.

"They believe they can do anything," says Jayne.

Vision Australia has worked with the family for a decade to ensure the children have the confidence, skills and equipment to live the lives they choose.

One of our Early Childhood Educators visited Jayne and David after Jacob's birth to offer support and advice. An Early Childhood Educator continues to visit Nicholas at preschool to observe his progress.

He enjoys the same stories as his friends thanks to the Vision Australia Feelix Braille Library for children. Each Feelix kit contains a brailled storybook, an audio book and tactile objects that bring the tales to life.



Vision Australia has liaised with the children's teachers to ensure they can access the same materials as their classmates. At school, Kate and Jacob are supported by a Vision Australia Visiting Teacher. She brings Kate large print books and teaches Jacob to use screen reading software. Jacob is also learning to use a digital playback device, a machine that can pinpoint sections of an audio book.

"We've always looked at what they can do rather than the limitations," says David. "There will be challenges in their lives, but we want to get them off to a positive start."

With self-belief and access to information, support and training, the Law children will go far.

#### At Vision Australia we believe blindness and low vision should not prevent full participation in life.

As such, we provide the equipment, training and support that enables people who are blind or have low vision to engage in activities that many of us take for granted, such as playing sport, cooking, reading a newspaper and catching public transport.




Kate's drawing as her dad sees it.

# 70 years of magic

It's hard to believe this event, which now captivates millions of Australians every Christmas Eve, was inspired by a lone caroller who Norman Banks caught sight of 70 years ago.

The following year, 10,000 people joined Banks in song at the Alexandra Gardens in the Domain for the very first Carols by Candlelight.

Carols continued to grow during the war years. Back then the event would have kicked off with a stirring rendition of God Save The King, with community bands and choirs featuring alongside big names such as Gladys Moncrief, Australia's 'Queen of Song'.

In 1958, 100,000 people attended the first Carols held at the new Sidney Myer Music Bowl. Named after the department store founder and philanthropist, the opening of this amphitheatre ushered in a new family-friendly era of Carols.

When Vision Australia's Carols by Candlelight was first televised in 1970, it introduced the event to an even wider audience. The Nine Network took over the broadcast in 1979, bringing the show to millions of Australian households every year. Throughout the nation, people now wrap gifts and greet guests to the accompaniment of this unmissable live event.

Over the years the bill has read like a Who's Who of the Australian entertainment industry with Rolf Harris, Hugh Jackman, Tina Arena, John Farnham (or Johnny, as he was known, noted in the 1969 program for his "way-out attire"), Debra Byrne, Olivia Newton-John, Lee Kernaghan, Judith Durham and Delta Goodrem taking to the starlit stage and leading singalongs.

Then there are those vital members of the Carols family who appear year after year – Marina Prior, Denis Walter, Douglas Heywood, Silvie Paladino and our host Ray Martin. They never fail to put on a show that is both respectful and fun.

Of course, Carols is never complete without a showstopping visit from Santa. Despite having a busy night ahead of him, the big man always manages to drop in to the Bowl on Christmas Eve.

Vision Australia would like to thank all the performers, volunteers, technicians and musicians who have worked so hard to present this magical event that holds such a special place in our hearts.

And a big thanks to you for being part of Australia's favourite Christmas tradition.

Ray Martin

With an outstanding career as a television journalist for more than four decades, Ray has helped shape Australian life both through his professional roles as well as his extensive charitable and community service.

Ray has worked for the major current affairs programs since 1965, covering Australian events and the world for 60 Minutes, A Current Affair and Four Corners. He has received five Gold Logies as well as People's Choice, Variety and Mo awards. Ray is the Nine Network's Senior Correspondent and currently co-presents the Nine Network's Sunday program with Ellen Fanning.



John Foreman

John Foreman is one of the most respected musical directors in the country. With impressive credentials, he has been appearing on Australian television screens for more than 15 years.

John took over the reins of musical director for Vision Australia's Carols by Candlelight in 2003, the same year that he joined Australian Idol.

A respected songwriter and record producer, in 2005 John released his first book, John Foreman – Your Guide to Unlocking the Australian Music Industry. He also hosts The Big Night In With John Foreman, a music variety show.

This year, John was the ambassador of an Australian Music Council initiative to encourage and support the importance of music education in our schools and among the nation's youth.



Anthony Callea

Anthony Callea is the Ambassador for Vision Australia's Carols by Candlelight 2007, and this year marks his fourth appearance at the event.

At only 25, he is one of Australia's greatest contemporary voices. His rendition of The Prayer is still the fastest and highest-selling Australian single of all time. Anthony has accumulated many awards, including Channel V Artist of the Year, Pop Republic Artist of the Year and an MTV Viewers' Choice Award.

Anthony recently entertained viewers on It Takes Two and has just finished performing the lead role of Mark in the musical production Rent alongside Tim Campbell and Nikki Webster.

One of our greatest performers, Marina Prior's talent is acknowledged internationally. In 2006 she was honoured with induction into Australia's 100 Entertainers of the Century.

Since her debut in The Pirates of Penzance, she has played over 20 lead roles, including Cosette in Les Miserablés, Maria in West Side Story and Christine in The Phantom Of The Opera. She has also toured extensively, including an acclaimed tour with José Carreras. Next year Marina will perform the role of Miss Adelaide in a new production of Guys And Dolls.




This is Terry's 20th year appearing as Santa's helper at Vision Australia's Carols by Candlelight, and we thank him for his captivating performances.






