Jake Wood of Melbourne is one of the bubbliest four year olds you'll ever meet.

The footy-mad youngster is this year's official face of the 2013 Carols by Candlelight® presented by Myer.

Jake has Ocular Albinism, which causes Nystagmus, an involuntary movement of the eye. Jake was diagnosed as a baby and since then his parents, Amy and Arron, have been working closely with Vision Australia's Children's Services to

help Jake adjust to life with low vision.

Arron and Amy felt lost after Jake's diagnosis, and describe it as, "the biggest shock of our lives."

Amy explains, "It wasn't until an early childhood educator from Vision Australia came to visit me and explained exactly how Nystagmus would affect Jake that we felt a sense of reassurance that things would be ok."

When she reflects on the support of Vision Australia Amy says, "Without

doubt they have been the biggest factor in Jake becoming the confident child that he is today. Jake's hand eye co-ordination is at its best possible level- which means he can play the sports that he loves, just like his friends from kinder."

"Thanks to Vision Australia, Jake now has the same opportunities as other children and we, as parents, are better educated on how to go about getting the best help and resources for Jake in the important years ahead."







Carols by Candlelight favourite, Callea, is thrilled to return as an Ambassador for the event, as is Leahcar who resumes her role as an Ambassador for the second year in a row.

ARIA award winning Callea is undoubtedly one of Australia's most acclaimed performers. His debut single 'The Prayer' became Australia's fastest and highest selling single of all time in 2004.

Since the show, Rachael has released a top 5 selling album, 'Shooting Star', toured with Goodrem, released her second album, 'Romantique' and thrilled audiences with her live performances in Adelaide, Sydney and Melbourne.

Together, Callea and Leachar proudly represent this iconic event and most importantly, support the ongoing work of Vision Australia in the community.

Children's Services

Early assistance is vital for children who are blind or have low vision. Sometimes families discover at birth that their new baby is blind or has low vision. At other times it is not so much a moment of discovery as weeks and even months before a diagnosis is made. as was the case with Jake, this year's Face of Carols.

However when it is diagnosed, families need both immediate support to help them understand what their child's diagnosis means and an ongoing plan carefully designed to assist that child to develop the skills and mobility to meet the same milestones as their sighted peers.

Vision Australia specialists, including orthoptists, therapists, educators, orientation and mobility trainers, adaptive technology consultants and counsellors work with the child's family to support their priorities for the child. It costs \$12,000 for a child who is blind to get the technology they need to go to school and continue their education.

While sighted children are motivated to explore the world through visual

cues and copying others, children who are blind need more encouragement and stimulation.

We support and empower families to address their child's individual needs so that their child can be ready for preschool then school and on to further education or training. It costs \$5,200 each term to run vital school holiday programs to help prepare secondary students for school leaving and employment.





Our Children's Services staff



Vision Australia's Children's Services includes orthoptists, therapists, early childhood educators, orientation and mobility specialists and counsellors who work with families to provide support and knowledge to address their child's particular needs. Here's a bit more about what they do.

Vision Australia early childhood educator Patricia Izzard says the best part of her job is getting to work with remarkable families, their children and a dedicated team of professionals. Patricia's role involves working alongside families and services, supporting

them to build their capacity to maximise children's learning, development and community participation. "It is very satisfying for me to see the positive results that can be achieved when families and services work together towards better outcomes for children with blindness or low vision," she says.

Children's Services speech pathologist Grace Kircher plays a pivotal role in developing the communication between a child who is blind or has low vision and their parents, carers and peers, as well as equipping them with the appropriate communication skills to participate in life.

Grace travels all over Victoria to support families in their home

setting. She works with the family to develop the best strategy for the child's needs and educates the parent on how they can best support their child's communications skills.

Natalie Kaine is a paediatric occupational therapist who has been with Vision Australia for 13 years. Natalie works with school-aged children and their families in Sydney, across regional NSW and interstate. She says her favourite part of the role is talking with kids about their futures, for example, what do they want to do when they finish school, what do they want to be when they grow up? That leads to conversations about preparing for that future. "My goal is to help young clients develop the skills they'll need to have choices when they finish school," she says.







Vision Australia's volunteers

Each year at Vision Australia's Carols by Candlelight ® presented by Myer over 170 volunteers play key roles in making the event what it is.

Our volunteers are vital to the running of the event; they do everything from scanning tickets, selling candles, counting money, distributing stock, chaperoning

guests and performers, and are often on their feet for long periods of time. The age range of volunteers is from 16 years to 70.

For many of them, volunteering at Carols by Candlelight is their tradition. This year, we are thrilled to celebrate Paul Worsnop who marks 39 years of volunteering with Carols.

Volunteers, like Paul, choose to give up their Christmas Eve and time with their own families because they believe Christmas is about giving back.

Vision Australia appreciates the support these volunteers give each and every year.

If anyone knows Carols by Candlelight, it's Paul Worsnop who has been volunteering at the event for 39 years.

Paul started his relationship with Carols when, as a teenager, his family became involved through a community orchestra group which ran a stall selling candles. The family eventually took over the running of the stall and continue to run it today.

Up until recently, three Worsnop generations manned the stall. Paul, and his brother, Christopher, have been to every Carols since 1974.

"Being a part of the event for that length of time has a special meaning in itself, especially seeing how it has developed and grown over time. I've observed the change in the city back drop and the way the buildings set their lights for the night."

A highlight for me is that each year I see so many smiles, it's the joy of Christmas. This is a cumulative thing that adds something significant to my heart each year, it has become a part of who I am. I enjoy it because it gives me a sense of service, but now it has

also become the Christmas tradition for me and my family. We are a family who enjoys serving the community," Paul says.









The story of Carols by Candlelight



Carols by Candlelight began on Christmas Eve 1938 thanks to the inspiration and enthusiasm of Melbourne radio announcer Norman Banks.

The first Carols was held in Alexandra Gardens and was attended by a healthy crowd of 10,000. The event grew in importance during the Second World War when community spirit was much in need. In 1958, the event was moved to the Sidney Myer Music Bowl.

The Royal Victorian Institute for the Blind (now Vision Australia) partnered with Carols as a charity sponsor assuming responsibility for the event in 1969. And so, on December 24, 1969, a new Christmas Eve tradition began in thousands of homes across Melbourne because for the first time Carols by Candlelight was broadcast on television, meaning that the iconic event could be enjoyed by thousands of families unable to travel into the city to participate. Now in its seventy-sixth year, it continues to be enjoyed throughout households across Australia.









The stars



John Foreman

A pianist, musical director and composer, John Foreman has been appearing on Australian television for nearly two decades.

John has been musical director for Vision Australia's Carols by Candlelight since 2003 and continues to help make Christmas Eve a musical extravaganza.

Lisa Wilkinson & David Campbell

Vision Australia's Carols by Candlelight tonight welcomes a new hosting combination with the Nine Network's Lisa Wilkinson joining forces with David Campbell.

For more than two decades, Lisa has blazed a trail through the Australian media landscape, first in publishing, then on to radio and now television, where she co-hosts Nine's top-rating Today. Tonight will be her sixth year in a row as co-host of Vision Australia's Carols by Candlelight.

David Campbell is one of Australia's most popular entertainers. A multi-platinum selling recording artist, David has starred in theatre and cabaret, recorded three Top Ten albums, and sold out concert tours from coast to coast. He now co-hosts Nine's popular Mornings program. He has performed at Carols on six occasions, but tonight marks his first night as co-host.

She has played roles in Les Miserables, Cats, Miss Saigon, Hair, Mamma Mia! and Chess, for which she received a Helpmann Award nomination, and has performed for celebrated theatrical composers, Stephen Schwartz and Stephen Sondheim.



Rachael started singing lessons at the age of nine. With Italian grandparents, she spent much of her childhood singing in Italian. Rachael also sings in French and Spanish.

A talented musician, Rachael also plays the piano and the flute and has sung in numerous choirs. Rachael attributes her strong connection with music to the fact that she is 90% legally blind.

Rachael wants to be known as a singer, not the blind girl who sings. It was her breakout performance on the Nine Network's The Voice that has given her that opportunity.

Her first album Shooting Star debuted at No. 5 on the ARIA charts.

Rachael's second album Romantique was released earlier this year and is a collection of contemporary, classic and original songs backed by orchestral instruments.







Australian Girls' Choir

The Australian Girls' Choir has dazzled audiences with their energetic and vibrant performances over the past 30 years. They have performed with a long list of artists from the entertainment world including Hugh Jackman, Guy Sebastian, Delta Goodrem and Olivia Newton-John.



Darren Percival

Darren Percival sang his way into the hearts of Australians as a favourite on The Voice in 2012.

His album Happy Home debuted at No. 3 on the ARIA Chart and Darren went on to sell out his national tour.

Darren is honoured to be back at Vision Australia's Carols by Candlelight and is set to treat his fans to a series of surprises in 2014.

Anthony Callea

ARIA winner Anthony Callea is considered to be one of this country's most powerful voices.

In 2013, Anthony celebrates his tenth anniversary performing at Vision Australia's Carols by Candlelight.

He has toured with Celine Dion and Whitney Houston and was chosen to perform for Luciano Pavarotti and Queen Elizabeth II.

Anthony is currently treading the musical theatre stage once more, playing the role of Johnny Casino in Grease The Musical alongside Bert Newton and Todd McKenney.



His latest album This is Christmas has just been released and features 12 iconic Christmas songs including The First Noel, Amazing Grace and Don't Save It All For Christmas Day.








David Hobson

The National Boys' Choir of Australia





Jayne's Story

All three of Jayne Law's children have a condition called Aniridia, which is where the coloured iris in the eye is missing, so they can't regulate the amount of light that goes into their eyes. They also have Nystagmus which means that their eyes move involuntarily.

Vision Australia has been with Jayne and her children right from the start. When Jacob, Kate and Nicholas were toddlers, they attended Vision Australia's playgroup for children with low vision, where they could play with other children, while also learning some fundamental skills under careful supervision from Vision Australia's specialist staff.

Jayne feels that Vision Australia has been particularly valuable with integration, helping each of her children attend kindergarten and school, and educating teachers on how to accommodate each child's individual needs.

Micaiah's Story

Micaiah was born with Peters Anomaly in both eyes, and one of Micaiah's eyes is microphthalmic. After surgery at four weeks old, Micaiah gained some sight in one

of her eyes and can now see about three metres away.

Corina, Micaiah's mother, initially felt lost and was left wondering how she could best prepare her little girl for the challenges ahead. Corina was referred to Vision Australia by Micaiah's doctor, and found comfort in the support given, especially with its counselling service. Vision Australia staff also helped her understand how she could support Micaiah and assist with her individual development and learning.
