Sir, I have the honor to inform you that a public meeting took place here on Saturday for the purpose of agitating the abolition of the Licence Fee. Mr S. Sub Inspector Winch attended and informs me that everything was conducted quietly, and with the exception of the language used by a man named Wale, nothing intemperate or violent was said.

Some written placards have been placed on the Trees containing the following words. "Diggers instead of carrying to your claims your licences, carry your revolver to protect yourselves against Official Ruffianism"
