# For Sale . . . THE ARTISTS OF KEW

After the land sales of the 1840's, Kew became a semi-rural suburb of Melbourne with farms situated along the Yarra flats, orchards, vegetable gardens, heavily timbered hills and paddocks for grazing stock. A small village grew up between Princess Street and Dendy Street, bounded by Eglington Street in the north and Cotham Road and Wellington Street in the south.

Many tracts of land were turned into large country estates for wealthy retired graziers, members of the judiciary, prominent churchmen, Members of Parliament. Street names like Henty, a'Beckett, Macartney, Stawell etc. honour these early pioneers.

Because of its leafy seclusion and availability to riverside scenery, golden wattle groves and gum forests, the area became a favourite place for artists to reside and paint. The names of the artists of Kew reads like a dictionary of famous painters and important art movements in Australian history.

A complete history giving biographies of all the artists, their influences, the art movements to which they belonged, and their place of residence in Kew has never been documented or researched before, but now a book has been written to fill the need.

"The Artists of Kew" contains information about many famous painters including Brovelot, Tom Roberts, Sir John Longstaff, Max Meldrum, Napier Waller, and dozens more, from Colonial times and The Heidelberg School to "avante garde" and contemporary Modern Art today.

There is a sketch of historic "Swinton" on the cover, home of the Colquhoun family of artists. This book is priced at \$2.50 and it is available at The Copy Shop, Walpole Street, Kew (near High Street) open between 10.30 a.m. - 2 p.m. every Friday.

Ian Frederick Lowe was born in 1952 in Wedderburn, Australia. In 1970 he began vocal studies with Ian Field, Melbourne. He became the 1973-1977 "David Allen Memorial Scholarship" holder, and in 1977 was a State finalist in the ABC Vocal & Concerto Competition. In 1979 he was awarded a twelve month Foreign Student Scholarship by the Austrian Government.

Performing in 'Cosi fan tutti' in the Elverum Festival Norway in 1980, he then returned to Australia in November 1980 and has been in demand for concerts and recitals and has appeared on television and recorded for the A.B.C.

Kaye Allen is the widow of David Allen. She is well known in Melbourne as an accompanist, being the official accompanist for many Eisteddfods and organizations. She is also a fine piano teacher and vocal coach.

Miriam Leuba, a student of Roy Shepherd, is in her final year of the Degree Course at the Victorian College of the Arts. She gained her Licentiate in Music while doing her Higher School Certificate at M.L.C. Miriam has been a winner at the many competitions in which she has partaken in Melbourne and Victoria. Her most recent success was winning the 'Jean Beddoe Memorial Award' at the Dandenong Eisteddfod.
