1875 Historic Map of Old Kew

Recently we came across a very old and historic map made by hand in our archives at Kew Historical Society. The map was in a state of mildew and decay with age, and thanks to the suggestion of Brian White of Kew, we have had this unique map reproduced in a good condition by the carbon-black process of Rank Xerox. The result is a fascinating study of old Kew as it was over 100 years ago.

It shows the old watercourses (now sealed over with bitumen roads); the forests of Red Gum timber at North Kew; the 3 main early farms of pioneer settlers - Wills Farm, Belford Farm and Kilby Farm; it shows the paddocks for grazing dairy and beef cattle, Pat Mornane's paddock where Xavier College now stands, Bowe's paddock stretching from Princess Street to the river at Studley Park; it shows the site of all the houses in Kew along the main road routes (the Bulleen Road, now called High Street and Cotham Road) as well as the dwellings in the small village of Kew bounded by Princess, Eglington, Derby and Wellington Streets; and it shows the sites of the old mansion homes of Kew standing in their original acres of property, homes of pioneer families such as the Henty's of "Roxeth" and "Tarring", the Lathams of "Raheen", etc.

Some of the interest of this map is that parts of the writing has faded and must be studied with a magnifying glass to decipher all the information. There is a list of the names of the pioneer families listed under the street names in which they lived, which will be of great interest to those tracing geneologies.

This map was hand-drawn by Mrs. Dannock, a member of a pioneer family who made home-made bricks on their property in Kew village near Derby Street for the earliest houses. Mrs. Dannock was an aunt of the late Dorothy Rogers, author of "The History of Kew" who is commemorated by the Dorothy Rogers Reserve at Kew Junction.

The occasion for producing this map was a Back-To-Kew celebration of the earliest pioneers in 1875. One of the members was moved to write a poem also reproduced at the top of the map which ends with the words in the Victorian sentimental vein:

"Once boys and girls, now old and grey Our lives we cannot shape anew, The vow once made on this dear spot To God and friends we will be true And trust we all shall meet above When we no more can meet in Kew".

As this map is expensive to reproduce and the size measures a yard in length, limited copies have been printed at \$8 a copy. If you would like your own copy of this unique and historic map, please order your copy from The Copy Shop, Walpole Street, Kew (near High Street corner) or ring 861 6281 on Friday only, between 10.30 a.m. and 2 p.m. Orders will take some weeks to process and as Kew Historical Society has only limited funds for the project, please make definite orders to collect at a later date.
