MACKENZIE LODGE No. 15 V.C. NEWSTEAD

Among the many pioneers and brethren who, in the early days gave vigorous service to the support and nourishment of Freemasonary, and the building of solid foundations for its progress, none is better remembered than Wor. Bro. R.C. McKenzie. For it was after him that the Lodge was named; and it was with his permission that the first two meetings were held in the Maldon Court House.

There were other good reasons for special regard to the memory of Robert Cleghorn Mackenzie. His life loomed large in the early history of Maldon. Son of an Edinburgh doctor, he arrived in Adelaide in 1849 to seek fortune as a squatter. But he was attracted before long to Victoria – and to Maldon – when the exciting gold discoveries drew so many to the new fields. And, in due course, Mackenzie became a Goldfields Commissioner, serving at Bendigo, Castlemaine and Blackwood. In 1856, he was transferred to Maldon as Warden and Police Magistrate at the early age of 27. Very soon he made his mark as an energetic, public-minded citizen; among other things, he played a big part in the establishment of the Maldon Hopsital and in its administration; in masonic affairs; and in sporting activities.

He was, indeed, a civic leader who gave much fine service to the people of the district. It is not surprising therefore, that the Mackenzie Lodge bore his name.

First Meeting

The story of Mackenzie Lodge over the years can be traced through the minute books and records which have been faithfully preserved. The earliest date found in the minutes is December 8, 1857; and this entry refers to a meeting which was held to settle details of the first meeting of the Lodge which was to take place in the Court House, Maldon, on December 11, 1857.

The meeting opened at 1.30pm and after the preliminary proceedings, R.C. McKenzie, who was in the chair, presented the gavel to Wor. Bro.Ball, W.M., Mt. Alexander Lodge. The latter, with the assistance of Bro. Hugh Barklay SW: R.C. Mackenzie SW; J. Brown, Tyler; and twelve other brethren, then conducted the ceremony of initiating five candidates. After this, the Lodge was opened in the second and third degrees, in due form. Bro. Ball announced that he would proceed with the installation of the Worshipful Master Elect. The Lodge was then opened in the P.M.'s degree, and Bro. C.H. Hardy - a medical man - was duly installed, Bro. Ball being assisted by the Past Masters Mackenzie, W. Davidson and T. Staggs.

First Newstead Meeting

In May 1871, the first regular meeting of the Mackenzie Lodge was held at the Mechanics' Institute, Newstead. Bro. Garsed, a member of the Golden Lodge and W.M. of the Zenith Lodge, duly consecrated the room for Masonic purposes. He was assisted by Bro. Bond SW No. 692 who read the exordium, and by Bro. Dolphin in the ceremony of distributing the wine, oil and salt.

Present Lodge Room Purchased

Until February 27, 1907, the Mackenzie Lodge held its meetings in the Mechanics' Hall at Newstead. In 1906, it had been felt that to provide a new building suitable for Lodge purposes at a cost - in those days - of three hundred pounds, would be too much for the Lodge finances. Instead, it was decided to buy the Primitive Methodist Church building - the present Lodge room. This was duly done; and the first meeting was held there on February 27, 1907.
