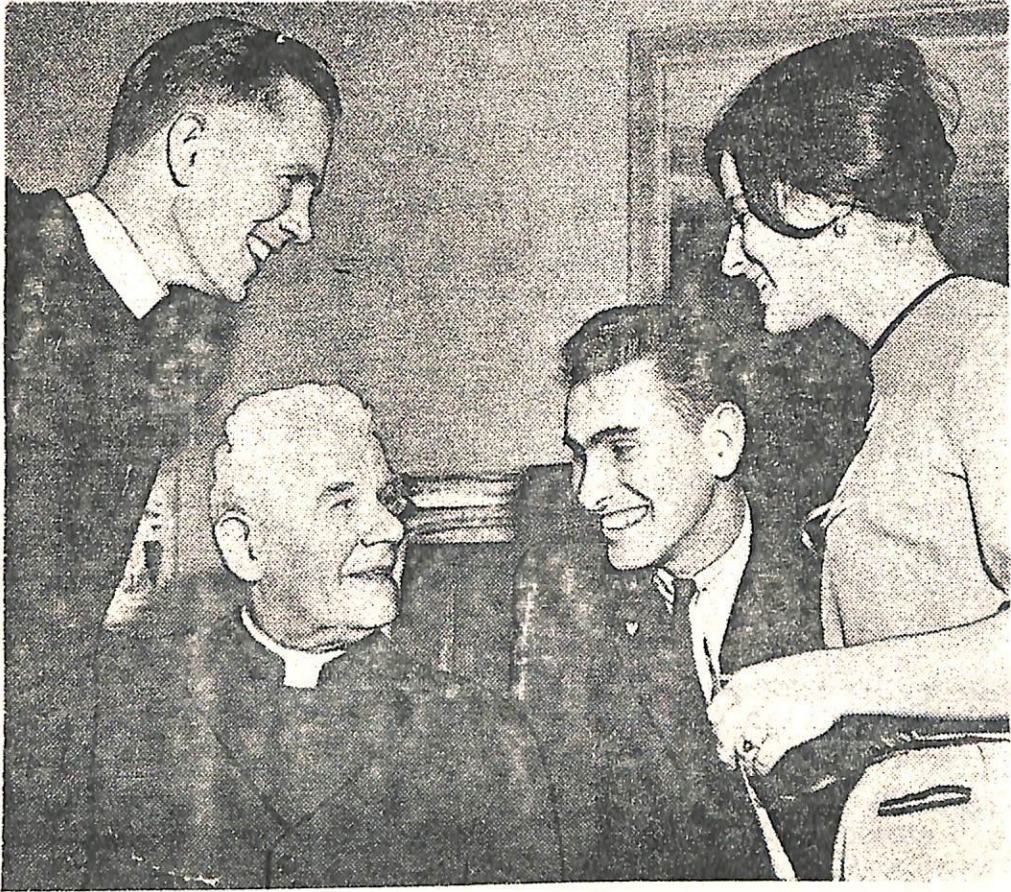

"You can be very proud of Helen (Jagoe) and she has done very well in giving the report on the Oceania region, she was really good and when she finished everyong applauded - she is the only one who has been clapped after speaking.

A terrific spirit at this meeting. All colours and languages, but great unity and friendship.

Two weeks for the International Executive Meeting, and the last day finished at 10.30PM, (Having started at 9.00am, of course).

I walked past Fred Astaire's Dancing Studio in NEW YORK on the way from Mass today, also past Waldorf Astoria, Pan-Am, Time, Life and all these other skyscrapers we hear about. It is an incredible city - skyscrapers all around and prices match the buildings. I'm eating at all the counter hash places, walk along looking for the cheapest prices, but still paying more than the price of a really good meal at home.

FOR A FEW DAYS, I WAS WITH MONSIGNOR CARDIJN IN CANADA. HE WAS AN INSPIRATION :-

Some quotes from Cardign - - -

"WE ARE ONLY AT THE BEGINNING OF Y.C.W...."

"POPE JOHN SAID TO ME - 'We are y ung and we will work together to save the workers of the world. (More than Pius XI, and Pius XII, I want to be with you. I want the world wide Y.C.W. It will save working youth"

DOPE ADDICTS IN NEW YORK: "Some spend 35/40 dollars (nearly £20) a day on drugs; they have to steal and become peddlers to get the money.

COMMENT OF A NEGRO Y.C.W. LEADER - "The white youth want to help us, instead of wanting to work with us."

IN BRUSSELS - INTERNATIONAL H.Q. - "On October 3rd, as St. Therese is Patroness of YCW, they have a special celebration - everyong comes to midday Mass in the Chapel, and there is very full participation. Fr. Ulyenbroeck (Asst. Chaplain) said the Mass & gave a talk on St. Therese as Patroness. Seve al intentions were prayed for aloud - one of the main intentions was for the "Success of the New National team of the Australian Y.C.W." (Executive)  
"Everyone here is very interested in what's happening in Australia.  
Hope the Combined Diocesan Conference was good. I was thinking of it this weekend & trying to do my bit for it over here.

FROM HELEN IN ROME: "Twelve of us were received in audience -- Monsignor Cardijn, Fathers Burke, Ulyenbroeck, Melanson & the National Chaplain from France, Bartolo Perez (Inter.President), Betty Villa (from the Phillipines, Inter Vice-Pres.) Denyse Gauthier (from France) Rienzie Rupasinghe (from Ceylon) and myself from the International Executive, and two National leaders from France. "The Pope told me to convey to our Australian leaders his greetings and best wishes in our work. We met the Pope in a small room, and he spent about 10 to 15 mins. with us, meeting each one and saying a few words to each.

We have met many Bishops here, from different countries around the world. Every day at 12.30, the Bishops file out of St. Peter's - 2,300 of them walking down the steps looks very impressive."

FATHER BURKE IN NAGPUR, INDIA, 19th OCTOBER : "Tomorrow a big meeting of the Chaplains of India begins, and after that, a National training week for boys. I'm really locking forward to this week."
