We are writing to confirm our agreement in principal with the development.

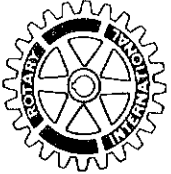
In particular, we are interested in the possibilities of Service Clubs being able to hold meetings and functions within the complex.

Re : Proposed Theatre Arts Centre

Among the uses our club would be likely to make of the proposed theatre arts centre are :-

1. Vocational :

- (a) we run an annual business community dinner, previously held at Emperor Court (limited to Chinese food) and other locations either too small or too noisy.
The proposed large function room would appear to be an ideal venue to retain local character and provide ample space for growth of this function.
- (b) the proposed foyer and function rooms would allow exhibitions on vocational themes to assist in career guidance.
- (c) the theatre would allow job selection film nights associated with exhibitions.

2. Fund raising :

The proposed facilities would open up a range of possible fund raising uses, such as

- (a) arts and craft shows (foyer and function rooms)
- (b) theatre nights
- (c) live performances in theatre or sound shell

3. Community service :

Possible uses include

- (a) theatre shows for elderly and disabled
- (b) auction dinners

The very presence of such a flexible centre would generate uses not now possible in Nunawading, and allow our club to run functions within the city.
