

EARLY HOTELS IN NUNAWADING AREA.

Keith Patterson spoke on Coach & Mail Routes & early Hotels at our last meeting & has provided some interesting notes on the subjects. The notes on Early Hotels are included in this issue, those on the Coach & Mail Routes will be included in the next Newsletter.

EARLY HOTELS

There are many gaps in the history of the early hotels which can be filled only by considerable research. The following information is available at present.....

- HARKAWAY INN
 Highbury Rd. near Springvale Rd. Application for licence lodged by Burrell, Sept. 1857. Position shown in a sketch applying for aid for Harkaway School, 1861.(In our N.H.S. archives).
- TRAVELLERS REST On present site of Blackburn Hotel, and has been there for many years. Licensee in 1905 William Dempsey.

 (We have copies of certificates of title, showing changes of ownership since 1884).
- KING GEORGE Whitehorse Rd. Blackburn, near present site of Latter Day Saints Church. Established by George King, who in 1868 applied to transfer licence to John Bull. Out of existance in 1905.
- HARVEST HOME

 John McGlone, Store-keeper applied for a beer licence in 1869. He was renting a shop at the present corner of Whitehorse Rd. & McGlone St. from John Gardiner; and gave his address as Main Gippsland Road. He applied for a licence for the Harvest Home Hotel at the end of 1873 & received it in Sept. 1874. His address was given as Doncaster Road Nunawading.
- EMERIES or EMERY'S HILL HOTEL Corner of Whitehorse Road & Station St.

 Mitcham. Licence held by McStone in 1875; M.A. Pearce in 1895 & Mary Jane Callaf in 1905. (Editor: Mrs Nance Leach recently located a tattered photograph of this pub taken in late 1917 when this tiny old hotel apparently closed. A scrawled notice on the building reads:

 "In sad & loving memory of the Hill Hotel. Passed away Dec. 3rd. 1917. Poor B." Interesting to record the demolition almost exactly 66 later of the building which succeeded the Hill Hotel:)
- RESERVE HOTEL On the south-east corner of Whitehorse & Mitcham Roads Licensee in 1895 was Alchard. Still a licenced hotel.
