The POD Certificates were presented by the PROV Director's senior representative, Mr David Brown, Senior Manager, Record Services, and the State MP for Gembrook, Ms Tammy Lobato, at the home of the Berwick and Pakenham Historical Society, at Pakenham on 12 May. The Society premises are based in a restored former Municipal Chambers and Courthouse, a very stylish venue for this important presentation.

The significance of being a POD is that we are eligible to receive on permanent loan, public records relating to our areas of interest that, for various reasons, are more appropriately stored outside the North Melbourne PROV office.

We look forward to receiving the new records, as they will add to the information held in the Local History Collection of the Society and be more readily available to local researchers.

More on our new Showcases

Visitors to the Museum will notice our two 'new' showcases, one with a new display of clothing, hand made and early machined 19th C underwear, and in the other case a display in progress.

Formerly used to house the NGV Decorative Arts collection the show cases were surplus to requirements after the major re-furbishment of the NGV International building in St Kilda Rd.

Barbara and Bob Gardiner put in a lot of work and liaised with Gallery staff to select the two cases of suitable dimensions and design and most important, arrangements were made for the cases to be delivered courtesy NGV.

Donations of documents, photographs, or artifacts for the collection are evaluated for suitablilty and accepted as per the acquisitions policy and criteria.

Cash donations are also appreciated—and don't forget that gifts amounts of \$2 or more are now recognised as tax deductible by the ATO.

Membership renewals can be paid in person at the AGM meeting or forwarded by post attention the Treasurer.

Bequests are another way to contribute, naming the Society in a will as recipient of an item of value, or a sum of money, or as recipient of interest derived from a trust fund established for the purpose.

From time to time people have enquired about wording of such bequests and for this reason we have included a section on our renewal form with a sample of the wording suggested by several nongovernment agencies and charities. Provision in a will is a good way of ensuring that your wishes are carried out. It is advisable however to always check with a legal adviser the best way this can be achieved.




