MISSION STATEMENT

The purpose of the Society is to foster historical interest and knowledge. To collect, document, research, preserve and exhibit items that show how people have lived and worked in the development of the Whitehorse area from human settlement to the present day.

For the Archives - The Teacher's College War memorial 1914-1918

A new information brochure has recently been published on the origins of a Memorial to World War 1 located at the University of Melbourne. The memorial consists of two parts: a three light stained glass window and a pair of opus sectile hand painted tablets with one hundred and eighty three portraits of Teachers College students, alumni and staff. One hundred and ninety five names are also listed on the windows the central panel of which features what is thought to be one of the earliest depictions of an ANZAC soldier in stained glass. The memorial was completed and unveiled in 1920.

Sergeant Richard E. Hughes born in Torrumburry near Echuca in 1891 died at Bullecourt 3rd of May 1917 and one of those portrayed was discovered to have a local connection. He was a schoolboy who grew up in Vermont and later became a junior teacher at Mitcham. The source of this information was a commemorative issue of a College newsletter with images and brief biographies, entitled The Trainee: Special War Number Sept. 1919. Information on Hughes has been supplied for the Whitehorse Historical Society files. Pat Richardson is carrying out further research to discover if there is any link with the Hughes family who operated the Grocery store in Canterbury Road and the business on the corner of Whitehorse and Mitcham Roads.

Many of the other people portrayed who attended the Teachers College in Grattan St Melbourne came from all over Victoria.

The memorial is significant as a visual record of people, their names, year of graduation, their military ranks and non military service occupations and could be one of the few sources of images for some descendants or families of trainee teachers who attended the College between 1900 and 1918.

The brochure provides a summary of the College history, and a full alphabetic listing of names on both parts of the Memorial with colour images of the two parts of the memorial. Copies of the brochure can be obtained by emailing the editor of this newsletter or by phone: on 03 8344 7158

CENSUS TIME CAPSULE

You may have read that, on Census night, 8 August 2006, you will have the option of allowing your census data to be kept securely for 99 years by the National Archives of Australia. This is in line with the policies of many other countries, and as family history researchers know, will provide a valuable source of information for future generations. Security of these records is assured, and nobody, including government and private organisations, will have access to them until their release date in 2105.

A detailed information booklet will be distributed to you with the census form that your household will be required to complete, and you can also consult the 2006 Census website at www.abs.gov.au/census if you wish.

The Society strongly urges you to allow your data to be preserved for future research.


