

Wattle Park

In June 2007 Mr Ray Peace, author of the book "Eliza's Vision: a History of Wattle Park 1838 – 2006"* was our guest speaker at the General Meeting. For those who could not attend here is a brief summary. The talk was recorded so if you would like to listen to it at the WHS rooms visit us on Wednesdays between 10 and 2.

Ray noted that Wattle Park was subdivided in 1853 but the first person to 'own it' was Eliza Welch of Ball & Welch, a well known haberdashery store in Melbourne. Eventually Eliza sold the land to the Hawthorn Tramways Trust which opened the Wattle Park in 1917. A pine tree was grown from a seed brought back from Gallipoli and there is also a memorial clock tower. In 1928 a Chalet was built with recycled materials which is still there and is thought to be haunted. During World War 2 the eastern oval was used as an army base and the Chalet

was an American Military base. In 1940 a Wattle Park Tramways band was formed and still plays during the summer months. The Friends of Wattle Park formed in 1990
