At our last meeting in June she was responding well to the chemotherapy but her aggressive form of cancer then took hold. Kaele was an outstanding contributor to the community and will be sorely missed. Our thoughts are with her family.

The launch of "Spiders in the Loo" was very successful and we were delighted to welcome Neil Angus, Member for Forest Hill on his first visit to the Schwerkolt Complex. Mayor, Cr Ben Stennett was also a guest and we look forward to his next visit to address our AGM in August. Crs Philip Daw and Raylene Carr were welcome return visitors. Several contributors of the book and their families were guests too. Gerry Robinson gave the book a memorable launch with his talk on the importance of history. Vale Kaele Way AM


We were all saddened to hear of the death of our Secretary Kaele Way AM. She was diagnosed with cancer only four months ago.

Kaele nominated for and was successful at the Whitehorse Council elections in 1997. She served six years as a Councillor representing Blackwood and Springfield Wards. She diligently represented and assisted residents of the wards and is fondly remembered by many people.

One of Kaele's endeavours was promoting Arts and Culture in the City and she was also concerned that our Heritage be recognized and protected.

In 2001 Kaele participated in the Museum of Victoria exhibition "Ordinary Women, Extraordinary Lives". This exhibition featured 263 Victorian women and toured the State.





Kaele was a member of the Local Government Women's Association Victoria and became their Secretary. She then moved on to be National President of the Australian Local Government Women's Association. As President she achieved success in obtaining grants to further the involvement of both elected and professional women and for them to participate and achieve in contributing to their municipalities. She coordinated a Review of the National Framework for Women in Local Government which has been adopted by many Councils through Australia.

In the Queens Birthday Honours in 2009 Kaele was made a Member (AM) in the General Division "For Service to the Community Through the Australian Local Government Women's Association".



Kaele was nominated as Secretary of Whitehorse Historical Society in 2008 and we are indebted to her for the contribution and knowledge she gave to our Society.

Amongst her many achievements Kaele also contributed to the Australian Red Cross Blackburn Branch, The Order of Australia Association Regional Group and the Mitcham Residents Association. Kaele also served as a Justice of the Peace.

We extend to her husband Alan, her children and her mother Ruth our heartfelt sympathy at their loss.


