President's Report:

- Objection to new offices at 360 Whitehorse Road placed by NDHS—there will be a
 Forum on Tuesday 31 July, Committee Room B please attend if possible. V
 Arrowsmith will speak. Cr K Way is chair. Issues: lessees' refurbishment of front;
 underground crapark and storage; drive replacing former path at west side of
 building; dispensation for ear parking; setback of offices. Heritage Victoria have
 been telephoned and notified in writing. Objection to granting a permit to vary from
 recommendations to be delivered to Council Monday 30 July am. Approved
 (Keene/Gardiner)
- Museum extension plans. Quantity surveyor's estimates very high for Option I
 (\$248K), Option 2 seems to interfere with cellar; Option 3 is unacceptably close to
 large tree on north side. We may have to explore an option which separates the
 Implement Shed from the main building. We will meet to discuss suggestions at 10
 am on Wednesday 3 August.
- Deep Crock Road bridge—Visit from four Council officers seems to indicate that the
 loop road from lower car park exit has been dropped from Council and VicRoads
 consideration. They are now examining possibilities of upgrading the upper
 entry/exit, with a turning loop at the lower (northern) end. However traffic
 mangement devices would seem necessary to make this solution practicable, such as a
 Roundabout, triggered traffic lights, closure of Deep Creek road as well as a Traffic
 Management Study by Whitehorse. A letter to this effect to go to VicRoads, with
 copies to Council, Manningham, Ringwood, Minister and Richard Casey.
- Proposal to acquire horse paddock deferred.
- Heritage Trail Council are proceeding, new sites still wanted.
- · Accreditation Working Party still attending to outstanding matters.
- Dolls and Teddies repair. \$65 approved for Princess Elizabeth doll (Rare!).
 Appropriate dress being investigated. Restoration of Lacquer Box, with abalone inlay, estimate \$110-120 approved.
- Agreed to continue identifying gaps in collection, but not to allocate specific funds for acquisitions
