# SOUND RECORDINGS DIGITISATION

Over the past 15 years, the Society has collected about 100 audio tapes. These comprise:

- · recorded talks by guest speakers on local people, places and organisations
- oral histories collected from local residents about their lives and memories of the local area
- oral histories collected from post-war migrants to Australia who settled in the Whitehorse area
- material on other topics, not connected with the Whitehorse area (about 20 tapes)

While most of these tapes have been transcribed for easy reference, the original spoken records have greater significance and should be retained indefinitely.

Audio tapes deteriorate through mechanical damage and electronic overprinting over time. A digital format would ensure their preservation, and also readily enable their transmission, copying or editing as required. CD-ROM is currently the cheapest and most accessible medium, which is also capable of further migration to different formats if required in the future.

A modest funding application from the Victorian Heritage Grants was recently considered. However, the application requirements were disproportionately rigorous, and the idea was abandoned.

It is therefore proposed that we fund the conversion from our own funds. There is about \$1200 unspent from the Oral History - Migration Project funding which could be put towards it.

A quote has been obtained of \$16.50 per tape for a quantity of 80+ tapes, a total of \$1320.00. If we did want to convert the 20 tapes of marginal interest, the total would be about \$1650.00.

If WHS Committee does not support this proposal, we could submit an application to the Council for a Community Grant in 2009. However, historically, our applications have seldom been funded beyond 50% of the amount applied for.

It is requested that Committee consider this proposal.

# INFORMATION FOR THE WHS COMMITTEE, MEETING 4 AUGUST 2008, RE ROBIN DA COSTA'S REQUEST

In July 2007, Neil Montagnana of Bounce Books, requested access to photographs of the Whitehorse area in our collection in order to illustrate a book commissioned by Fletchers Real Estate Agents. This was a celebratory book intended for free distribution to selected clients. We understand that 10,000 copies were printed.

I advised him where material might be found on his initial visit. Over several visits, photographs were selected and photographed by Neil, and a complimentary copy of the published book was donated to the Society by Fletchers in June 2008.

It was indicated to Neil at the time that it was the publisher's responsibility to ensure that appropriate copyright arrangements were made for the use of any of the photographs. In most cases, we had no records of the photographs' creators, donors or copyright holders. Most of the photographs appeared to be 70 years old or more, and many had been donated anonymously some 30-40 years ago. No photographs have had any conditions for or restrictions on access placed on them by the donors.

There is some degree of duplication in the collection. In particular, a collection housed in two folders of material collected by Robin da Costa for her book *Blackburn: a picturesque history* and donated to the Society by her in 1979 has been kept together regardless of duplication of a number of items in other parts of the collection. Like other material, there is no indication in these folders of who created the photos or who would hold the copyright to them.

Of the 51 photographs in the "Blackburn" section of the Fletchers publication, 11 have been identified as having been sourced from the da Costa folders. The remainder were sourced from other folders in the collection. No photographs appear to have been copied from the published book.

Ms da Costa made a request on 16 July to speak to a meeting of the Committee about this usage. It is not clear what the purpose of her request is. She visited the Local History Room on 23 July, speaking to Valda Arrowsmith and myself, and is compiling a list of the photographs in Folders 13 and 14 which she claims were taken by herself or her husband, and is intending to give us a copy. She said that she was meeting Neil Montagnana on 24 July.

As the Society, in the absence of any stated restrictions on access to the photographs, has simply allowed Mr Montagnana to view and copy some of them himself, there can be no complaint against the Society. Responsibility for meeting copyright obligations rests with the publisher, Fletchers.
