This report from 15 February 2011 to 30 April 2011, covers only the museum (175-H1) and is the final report with this device.

The desired parameters are:- Humidity 40-70% and Temperature 18-22c.

TEMPERATURE. For short periods the readings were often outside the acceptable limits.

Highest: 25.7c with humidity 71.2% at 2am on Saturday 12 March 2011.

Over a long period between March and April the other readings were below the required levels.

Lowest :- 13.6c with humidity 63.5% between 5.30 and 7.30am on Monday 11 April 2011.

HUMIDITY. The readings were high for long periods.

Highest: - 81.9% with temperature 21.6c at 9.37am on Saturday 12 March 2011.

At no time did the humidity go below acceptable limits during this period.
