settlements, that they so foolishly parted with in the first instance."

"I wrote a paper on this subject and read it before
the Agricultural Society at Learmonth about 1860. It
was not acted on, and hence the terrible results, with
our Estate gone, and only little over 1,000,000 people
and in many instances large numbers of them not well off.
With a public debt of £50,000,000, almost all the taxes
of the old country are in force here, including the
income or war tax. It is well worth pondering over our
condition by any reflecting writer who will work out
the cause and eff3ct.
