OUR ADJUDICATORS

CHIEF MUSIC ADJUDICATOR

Lieutenant Commander L. T. Lambert M.V.O., L.R.A.M., A.R.C.M. pdm.

L.C.D.R. Lambert joined the Royal Marines in 1940, undergoing training in the early war years in the Isle of Man, where has was taught all brass instruments and the violoncello. He saw war service in both the Atlantic and Pacific areas and first came to Australia in H.M.S. Duke of York in 1945. He progressed very quickly through the various ranks and was one of the youngest officers commissioned as a Director of Music. Whilst the British Army has its own School of Music at Kneller Hall, the Royal Marines prefer to have their more senior Non-Commissioned Officers and Officers qualify, like their civilian counterparts, by attendance at the Royal Academy of Music. Very early in his career he was selected for the Conductors course and during his years of study had further training in all instrumental studies from the distinguished players on the staff. He was awarded the Certificate of Merit, the Royal Academy's highest award on completion of his studies.

During the latter six years of his career with the Royal Marines he was Director of Music at Portsmouth, where an important part of his work was to embark a Band in H.M. Yacht Britannia whenever the Royal Family was in residence. He travelled all over the world in the vessel, his last tour being that to Australia in 1970.

He is a very experienced adjudicator, having been connected with all the major Festivals, Eistedfolds and Competitions in the United Kingdom and at the time he retired in November 1970 had just been appointed an examiner for the Associated Boards of Music.

In Adelaide he is the Staff Officer to the Naval Officer in Charge South Australia, though finds time to conduct the Training Orchestra of some 65 players at the Flinders Street Technical College, also the Concert Band of the same establishment. He has also played on occasions with the South Australian Symphony Orchestra.

ASSISTANT MUSIC ADJUDICATOR

Mr. Robert H. Davies

Mr. Robert H. Davies is a music teacher at Nailsworth Boys Technical High School where he has a Concert Band of 63 players—including 20 on the clarinet, 7 on brass instruments, including the euphonium, and a galaxy of guitarists. He is a member of the State Music Curriculum Committee for High Schools.

A married man with four children, he was born in Wales; studied the piano at 10 years, the clarinet at 13, and later played reeds and tenor horn with the R.A.F. Band at Cranwell, England. He studied music at Wolverhampton University, becoming an Associate of its Board of Music. Since coming to Australia 19 years ago he has continued his studies of music, and has followed also the hobbies of photography and ju jitsu. Mr. Davies will be assistant music adjudicator for these 1972 Competitions.

CHIEF DRILL ADJUDICATOR

Mr. C. F. Sorrell, M.B.E.

Mr. Cliff Sorrell is President of the National Band Council of Australia and Past President of the S.A. Bands Association Inc. and the S.A. Bands Marching Girls Association. In 1971 a business appointment was responsible

for his leaving this State and he now resides in Sydney, N.S.W.

He has adjudicated at Band Contests all over Australia and has judged at Tanunda since 1961. On five occasions he has been appointed to judge the National Championships of Australia and he judged the 1971 titles at Maryborough, Qld. His contribution to the development of brass banding in South Australia was rewarded when he was awarded an M.B.E. by Her Majesty the Queen in the 1971 New Year's Honours.

Mr. Pennell has been assistant drill judge on many occasions at Tanunda Competitions and has judged many Junior Band Contests in South Australia. He is a registered S.A.B.M.G.A. judge for marching girls competitions.

WELCOME-to Tanunda in the Barossa Valley

The Barossa Valley with its wine industry, its history of settlement by German Lutherans, and of incorporation of their traditions and way of life into the Australian setting, is one of South Australia's major tourist attractions. Its annual influx of tourists is increasing and along with this the district's facilities for catering to their needs.

One of the inherited customs of the pioneers that has continued is an

enthusiasm for brass bands and their music.

When the first German Lutheran settlers came into the Tanunda area they brought with them their brass band instruments. They played them at worship services, for weddings and the "tin-kettling" of the newly weds, and for fun at home and community functions. The Tanunda Band celebrated its centenary some years ago, and took part in band contesting when it was first introduced 60 years ago. The early settlers brought with them qualities of character that have left their mark in the town and district of today. The order and cleanliness of the town, the churches, the street trees, and the town's activities, all may be interpreted in relation to their pioneer origins.

This Tanunda Recreation Park is the centre not only of recreational activities, but has been the scene of religious festivities, charity functions, the Barossa Valley Vintage Festivals, and is the locale for the annual Agricultural, Horticultural and Viticultural Shows. The Show Hall is used by the Tanunda Liedertafel for its annual "Kaffee Abend," by the Festival Committee for its annual Vintage Dinners, and by the Tanunda Town Band for its annual "Melodienacht." It is the home of the Tanunda Youth Club.

The holding of the Evening Session of the Tanunda Band Competitions in the Show Hall has benefited competing bandsmen and spectators alike. It has given a top concert quality to the own choice selections of the top Bands—unaffected by wind, cold, or external noises. This year the "A" Grade Test Selections will also be played indoors during the afternoon.

The town of Tanunda and the Barossa Valley in general has much to show the visitor. Its churches, historical museum, wineries, homes and public buildings, its distinct scenery and varieties of rural production are full of interest. Visitors are invited to come again—and again. The town of Tanunda and its citizens welcome you, as do all citizens of the Barossa district.


