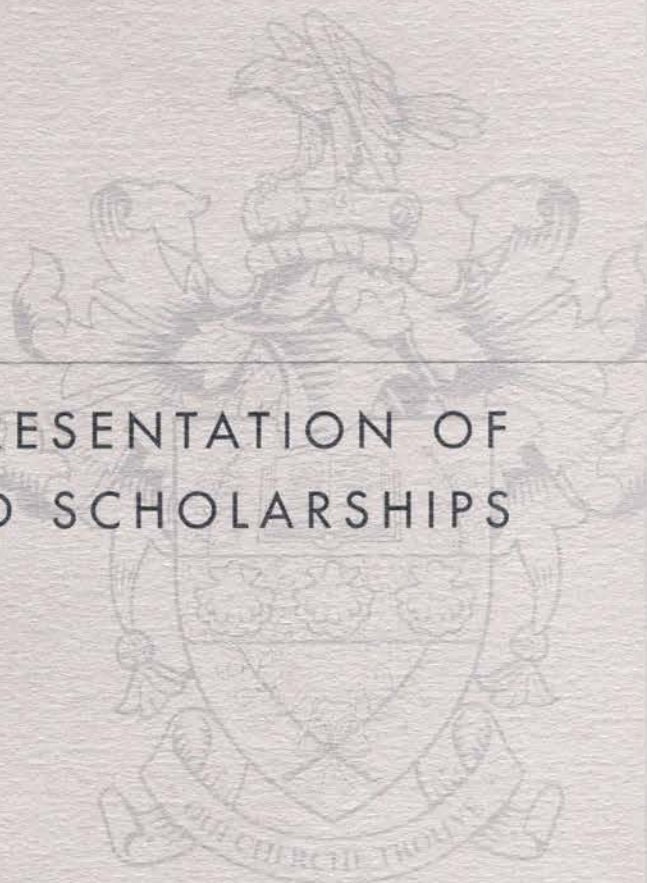

About La Trobe University

Here at La Trobe we believe that life at university is lived beyond the classroom. We aim to inspire our students as their achievements inspire us. Our History

La Trobe University is renowned as one of Australia's pioneering universities. Our motto "*Qui cherche trouve*" (Whoever seeks shall find) is just as relevant today.

In 1967, 552 students enrolled at La Trobe University, the third University to open in Victoria. We have grown to accommodate more than 26,000 students including approximately 3,500 international students from over 90 countries. We now have a network of campuses with 15,000 students at our Melbourne (Bundoora) campus and over 7,000 at our campuses in Albury-Wodonga, Beechworth, Bendigo, Mildura, Melbourne City and Shepparton.

Environmental Initiatives

La Trobe is at the forefront of environmental research and has been widely acclaimed for its climate change, ecological and water management research.

Our Research and Development Park (including a highly successful Business Incubator), is home to Rio Tinto, the Victorian AgriBiosciences Centre and from 2011, the Biosciences Research Centre (a \$230 million joint venture with the Victorian Government).

The Biosciences Research Centre will focus next-generation biosciences research on challenges including climate change and biosecurity preparedness. The new centre will give La Trobe University students and staff new opportunities to work with the world's leading scientists within a state-of-the-art research facility.

International Activities

La Trobe is one of Australia's leading international universities, and was ranked as one of Victoria's Top 3 universities by the respected Shanghai Jiao Tong University in 2006. We have links with more than 250 universities around the world and offer teaching and training in many countries, notably in China, Hong Kong, Singapore, Malaysia, Vietnam and Bhutan.

To encourage student mobility and to add a genuine international dimension to studies, we pioneered the development of the International Network of Universities (INU). The Network embraces leading universities in China, Indonesia, Japan, Spain, Hungary, Sweden, the U.S.A and the United Kingdom, and provides opportunities for La Trobe students to undertake part of their study overseas.

The D.M. Myers University Medal

Dr David M. Myers took up his appointment as the first Vice-Chancellor of La Trobe University in September 1965. In 1976 he was awarded the degree of Doctor of the University (honoris causa), in recognition of his services to the University from 1964 to 1976. Dr Myers donated the University Medal to be awarded annually to the outstanding honours graduate in each Faculty.

Cast in bronze from a design by the late Andor Meszaros, the medallion's theme is the origin of communication. A primeval hero is shown clubbing a lion and in the background there is a pictorial presentation – the first hieroglyph – suggesting the beginning of writing.

Letters of different alphabets, hieroglyphs, cryptograms and signs form the rest of the background and illustrate the development of written communication. Myths and legends evolve – depicted in the two seated figures recalling the hero's deed.

Andor Meszaros came to Australia from Hungary in 1939. A sculptor of international repute, his major works include the King George V Memorial Statue (Sydney, King George V Hospital) in marble, an altar piece in the Canterbury Cathedral, and the 1956 Olympic Medallion.

The Armorial Bearings

The La Trobe University armorial bearings were designed to include national and state emblems, images of scholarship and references to the La Trobe family, after whom the University was named (see separate entry on Charles Joseph La Trobe).

Australia is represented by the Wedge-tailed Eagle and Victoria by the sprigs of heath, the State's floral emblem. The open book symbolises learning and the scallop shells, which symbolise pilgrimages, are a reference to the armorial bearings of the La Trobe family.

The French motto 'Qui cherche trouve' (Whoever seeks shall find) is a modern version of the La Trobe family motto.

The Mace

The mace was originally a symbol of protection, i.e. a metal club traditionally carried to protect the Chancellor from adversaries. It is now a symbol of power and authority. Through the generosity of the late Lt Col. A.G. Oldham, CBE, ED, La Trobe University was presented with its mace prior to the first graduation ceremony in December 1969. It was designed and created in London by Australian silversmith Stuart Devlin.

Charles Joseph La Trobe

Charles Joseph La Trobe

Charles Joseph La Trobe did more to shape the Australian State of Victoria than any other man.

He arrived in 1839, only four years after the first white settlement when the population numbered fewer than 6,000. When he left in 1854, Victoria was the richest and most populous of the Australian colonies. The population was touching 300,000, self-government had been won, the goldfields were booming, the public library and art gallery were established and a university founded – the whole framework of modern Victoria had been set up.

La Trobe was first Superintendent of Port Phillip District from 1839 to 1850 and first Lieutenant-Governor of the new colony of Victoria from 1851. He had worked as a teacher in England and tutor in Switzerland, before he visited the West Indies to report on Negro education. After travels in Europe and North America, he wrote four books on his experience.

At Port Phillip, he encouraged the development of Aboriginal welfare and education and authorised establishment of the native police corps in 1842. Travelling on horseback, he visited

many sheep stations in the district and saw at first-hand the emergence of settled communities. In Melbourne he had interests in the churches of St James and St Peters, the inauguration of the Melbourne Hospital, the National Museum and the Mechanics' Institute.

During the 1840s, the first Government offices were opened on Batman's Hill, the Botanic Gardens site was reserved, the Melbourne Town Council was established and the first Elizabeth Street Post Office opened. La Trobe served as Administrator of Van Diemen's Land during 1846-47.

He gave assent to the Victorian act to establish the University of Melbourne in 1853, and in 1854 the Constitution Act was passed. Between 1851 and 1854, Government departments such as the PMG, the Goldfields Commission and the Police Force were created by La Trobe. New towns appeared and the building of railways and telegraph lines began. The Supreme Court was established in 1852.

La Trobe sailed for England in May, 1854. He was created a Companion of the Bath in 1858. He died in England on 4 December, 1875.
