But those that attended had a good day. He thanked everybody that helped. Steve O'Connor did a great job preparing the Laurie Adams Perpetual Trophy. The inaugural Laurie Adams Perpetual Trophy was won by Steve Hancock with his Chamberlain 9G. By a strange twist this is the same tractor that led the cortege at Laurie's funeral.

Member Rob McClure was kind enough to donate his prizes back to the Club and this enabled us to award a prize to two young chaps who want to get into tractor pulling. They competed under supervision and thoroughly enjoyed themselves.

Steve O'Connor moved that Sec. write a letter of thanks to Rob McClure this was seconded by John Blake and was carried. (This has been done.)

As the report on Mucklefest was part report and part could be regarded as general business as we discussed how to improve some aspects for next year. So there will be more points of interest in general business.

George told the meeting that the bridge beams we have inherited will have to be moved before Vossloh return to work after the Christmas break. The council are not involved and MAVEC and Vossloh will have to arrange transport. The Rotary Club are to get 1 and the other three are to come to Muckleford. The beams are 17 mts long and weigh 6 tonne each.

Loretta Rice knows where there is a merry go round driven by a horse works. It is for sale to a club for between \$3000 to \$3500 the price is higher if an individual was to by it. It is complete and in going order and has been always shedded. Loretta mentioned that the Club might consider buying it as it could be a drawcard at our Rally.

Sec. asked what did the Club want as the featured tractor and engine for our 2018 Rally. In very short time it was decided that NUFFIELD would be the tractor And BLACKSTONE would be the engine.

It was decided that Hammertone dark blue would be the badge colour for next year and it will be noted when we order that Guildford will be taken off the badge and Muckleford put on.

The meeting was asked if they wanted to produce a calendar again this year and the members agreed it was a good idea. Peter will be able to do it for us again.

Sec suggested that he contact car Club to see if they were interested in coming to our Rally next year, will keep members informed about this in future n/letters.

John Robinson brought it to our attention that a letter from us to VGR had not been tabled. Sec checked it out and as the letter had been emailed a hard copy had not been tabled this will be done at the next meeting.

The problem with the signing of the lease between us and VGR is that Victrack are dragging their heels on signing the lease with VGR, but VGR are happy for us to keep doing what we want to with the Muckleford site, eg; filling the low spot near the goods shed.

It was discussed that we may have to seek a donation from the party or parties Interested in acquiring our existing shed at Guildford, this could be used to obtain more temporary storage at Muckleford This will be addressed hopefully at our next meeting.

MUCKLEFORD SHED

As a follow up to our last meeting Steve O'connor came with 3 quotes for a shed he tabled the quotes and passed around to the meeting the plans for what he considered was the best all round deal, he has already erected 2 or 3 of these sheds and says they are a of good quality. The shed he recommended is constructed by Telfords based in Shepparton using all Aust. Steel. Steve said he would be able to build the shed with the help of Club members and it would be up and the floor concreted in time for our Rally.

After the members had looked at the plan Steve O'Connor moved we go ahead and order a shed as to the plan, this was seconded by Ray Rice and the motion was carried. A shed committee was formed it is the following Steve O'Connor, Peter Thompson, John Robinson and Graham Mason. This committee will seek a meeting with the Shire CEO asap to see what is involved to get all the relevant permits etc.

MUCKLEFEST DISCUSSION

As stated earlier in reports this discussion went on to make better plans and ideas for next years event. It was suggested that more seating should be provided at the horse display, a[so better arrangements for disabled parking. Sec. also pointed out that the photo in the mail showed the steam roller and it was not there, and went on further to suggest the organizers have only one person to liaise with the press so nothing can be taken out of context. Fine tuning of the exhibitor's gates may need to be discussed.


