

STAMP REPORT

We have now completed another year regarding stamps. I can now tell you that in the last 12 months we have raised \$20,716.25. That brings the Grand Total since March 1978 to \$112,694.12. Although the group started in 1971 we can only record \$1,000 from bulk sales as stamps were done up in sets and the money from those sales was put in with the daily takings. I know not so many stamps are used these days so I hope you will all make an extra effort to save more for Legacy next year. If it hadn't been for the Herald Sun BMW competition which gave us nearly 4

tons, our total would have been far less. As it is we just \$200 below our record of 2 years ago. Please remember to place stamps ½ from the corner of the envelope. Tear stamp off with at least 1 inch of paper around it then our trimmers will do the rest the way the buyer asks for. Once the perforation is broken they are of no use. They are sold by weight so the right amount of paper means more money for Legacy. Enjoy your Christmas break and please promise to try to save more stamps for Legacy next year. BACK TO CAULFIELD RACE DAY


7th September 1997



We, The Survivors

(A tribute to those men and women who were born before 1940)

We were born before television, before penicillin, polio shots, frozen foods. Xerox, plastic, contact lenses, videos, frisbees and the pill.

We were before radar, credit cards, split atoms, laser beams and ball-point pens: before dishwashers, tumble dryers, electric blankets, air fresheners, drip-dry clothes.. and before man walked on the moon.

We got married first and lived together (how quaint can you be?) We thought "fast food" was when you ate in Lent, a "Big Mac" was an oversized raincoat and "crumpet" we had for tea.

We existed before house husbands, computer dating, dual careers and when a "meaningful relationship" meant getting along with cousins, and "sheltered accommodation" was where you waited for a bus.

We were before day care centres, group homes and disposable nappies. We had never hear of FM radio, tape decks, electric typewriters, artificial hearts, word processors, yoghurt and young men wearing earrings. For us "time sharing" meant togetherness, a "chip" was a piece of wood or fried potato, "hardware" meant nuts and bolts and "software" wasn't even a word.

The term "making out" referred to how you did in your exams, "stud' was something that fastened a collar to a shirt and "going all the way" meant staying on a bus to the terminus. Pizzas, McDonalds and instant coffee were unheard of. In our day, cigarette smoking was "fashionable", "grass" was mown, "coke" was kept in the coal shed, a "joint" was a piece of meat you had on Sundays and "pot" was something you cooked in.

"Rock music" was a grandmother's lullaby, "Eldorado" was an icecream, and "gay" simply meant lively and merry.

We who were born before 1940 must be a hardy bunch when you consider how the world has changed and the adjustments we have had to make. No wonder we are confused and there is a generation gap... But by the Grace of God we have survived!



WALK WITH CARE

WHEN USING PUBLIC TRANSPORT

If you find the steps on buses or trams to be too high, don't be afraid to ask for someone's help when getting on or off.

Train Safety

Carelessness and over confidence are two of the main factors when a pedestrian is hit by a train. Like most accidents they are avoidable.

- when waiting for a train, stand on the station platform well clear of the approaching train. Stand behind the line painted on the platform until the train has stopped.
- At the railway level crossing be alert. If the bells are ringing, the boom barriers are down and the vehicles have stopped, do not commence to cross the crossing, even if you cannot see a train approaching: Never follow someone else across the railway line. You must wait until the bells stop ringing, the boom barriers are raised and the vehicles commence to cross the railway line.
- ALWAYS STOP LOOK LISTEN AND THINK WHEN CROSSING AT ANY RAILWAY CROSSING



Buses


There are safe ways of getting on and off a bus:

- wait on the kerb; don't step on to the road to check if the bus is coming
- after getting off the bus, walk straight to the nearest kerb. Never walk immediately in front of, or behind, the bus - you can be fined for this!
- wait well back from the road until the bus has departed before you cross.

Tram Safety

Unfortunately, accidents involving older persons and trams are quite common. If you use a tram remember to:


- wait at the kerb until the tram has stopped for you; never walk out before this.
- make sure that approaching traffic has stopped before you get on or off; it helps if you make eye contact with drivers of approaching vehicles
- walk straight to the nearest kerb or risk being injured or fined.





VICTORIAN SENIORS CARD

The Seniors Card is issued on request to all Victorian residents over the age of 60 and who are not in full time employment. Bearers of the Seniors Card are entitled to considerable savings on travel, shopping, dining out, home renovations and a range of other areas. It can be used to obtain the Sixty Plus fare on the Met and discounted fare on nominated country train travel.



Application forms for the Seniors Card are available from any post office. Applications take about three weeks to process and the Card is then posted to the applicant along with a copy of the current editions of the directories of discount providers.

WHAT IS LYMPHOEDEMA?

Lymphoedema is an accumulation of lymphatic fluid causing swelling - usually in the arm(s) or leg(s). It can also occur in other areas of the body such as the abdomen. It affects people of all ages - infants, children, men and women. Lymphoedema may be either primary (due to

congenital abnormality) or secondary (resulting from injury to the lymphatic vessels).

HOW WILL LYMPHOEDEMA AFFECT ME?

Lymphoedema can cause a feeling of discomfort, heaviness, tightness and pain in the limb. Joint movements may become restricted. As the limb swells, it may become subject to an increased risk of infection.

YES, LYMPHOEDEMA CAN BE TREATED!


Lymphoedema can be controlled and the swelling decreased by a conservative program which may include skin care, massage, compression garments, correct bandaging and an

exercise regime. Many therapists have now been trained to treat lymphoedema, and names and addresses are available from the Lymphoedema Association of Victoria Inc.

The earlier lymphoedema is diagnosed and treated, the more successful the results.

LEGACY - THE QUIET



In twelve months time, we will be celebrating Legacy's 75th Birthday. At this time we are reminded of how Legacy began:-

Legacy was founded in Melbourne in 1923 by a group of World War I Veterans. Their ideals of mateship engendered by front line service, led them to recognise the need for an organisation which accepts the Legacy of caring for the widows and children of their comrades who had not survived. These few men formed themselves into a body which was later called the Legacy Club, so named because they accepted an inheritance of trust - the spirit of service and sacrifice - from those who had laid down their lives for us, to care for their dependants. From this small beginning the Legacy ideal spread throughout Australia. There are 49 Legacy Clubs in Australia and one in London - all actively engaged in this chosen work.

To quote from W.B. Russell's book 'THERE GOES A MAN":

"Legacy is no mere hobby or spare time social activity
It demands a man's highest talents and energies. It brooks
no delay, no half-measures and no man may buy his passage.
No pay, no praise, no publicity, no thanks, no acknowlegement!
And personal effort is the main essential"

A closer look at the life of the leader of that group of veterans helps understanding the ideals of the organisation. Stan Savige, the founder of Legacy, lived out his philosophy that: "life itself is worthless without some form of service to the community".

Born in humble circumstances, he had to leave school at the age of 12 in order to help support his family. He managed to continue his education through private night classes; became a youth leader at Sunday School and was one of the early leaders in Scouting in Melbourne. In 1915 he enlisted as a private, and served with distinction with the famous 24th Infantry Battalion at Gallipoli, where he was commissioned in the field. He survived the horrors of the Western Front 1916/17. He was promoted Captain and awarded the Military Cross and mentioned in despatches for "conspicuous gallantry and exceptional good service". In June 1918 he volunteered and was selected for a hazardous assignment in Persia and Syria. He returned to Australia as Captain Savige DSC, MC, and had been mentioned three times.

In World War II he again distinguished himself as one of Australia's most respected and successful Commanders in the Middle East and South Pacific theatres of war.

By June 1950, the country lad from Korumburra was known for his warm heartedness and championship of the weak and less fortunate, he had served with determination in two World Wars, founded Legacy and risen to the rank of Lieutenant General Sir Stanley Savige, KBE, CB, DSO, MC, ED.

Today "Australia's Biggest Family" of Legacy widows totals over 127,000 and 2,100 dependents (children and disabled dependents). Of these, over 36,000 widows are in Victoria. Legatees faithfully fulfil a trust to continue caring for as long as there is a need.

OLDER PEDESTRIAN SAFETY PROGRAM

Pedestrian Safety for the Winter Months



Now that we are in the midst of winter it is important for all pedestrians and drivers to take extra care on the roads. As a pedestrian it is very important that you make yourself as visible as possible to drivers. Wear bright clothing (red, yellow, orange, white) or carry a bright accessory (umbrella, shopping bag, wrist band) that can be easily seen by approaching drivers. Where possible, cross the road using available traffic lights, pedestrian operated signals, pedestrian (zebra) crossings. If there is no available crossing facility, cross where you and the drivers have a good clear view of one another. Do not cross between parked cars or on the crest of a hill.

It is during these months we seem to get the flu, a common cold or other illnesses. If you have the misfortune of being ill at this time and visit a doctor, ask them or your pharmacist what the possible side affects might be from the medication prescribed.





Find out if your medicines could affect your safety as a pedestrian

Ask your doctor what they have prescribed and how to correctly take the medication. Whilst the medication may relieve your present illness, it may also have an affect on your concentration, reflexes, balance, hearing as well as possibly affecting your mobility. Also ask your doctor what the possible side effects might be on your ability to drive or walk

The traffic environment at the best of times, can be extremely busy, noisy and confusing, and it can be even more unnerving when we are not feeling our best. It is in these situations that we have to take even greater care when out walking or driving. You may like to ask a friend or relative to accompany you on the outing or to pick up some things that you need at the shop.



THE BIRTH OF LEGACY HOUSE

The following story was recently published in the "Bulletin" and is condensed for the benefit of our readers:

The First War Legatees had a tough task during WWII, caring for their own Legacy widows and their children, and coping with the very young widows and their children of the men killed during WWII. The Club then had rooms in the old Western Market, on the block bounded by Collins Street, William Street, Flinders Lane and Market Street. It was an ancient building but the rent was cheap. Legacy had a small suite of offices with a paid staff of half-a-dozen and a large space for Girls' Classes, all upstairs on part of the first floor. In addition there was an Lending Library for widows and children.

But Legatees became fearful of the possibility of a disaster, if the old building caught fire, causing a stampede of children down those steep and narrow stairs.



At the same time Melbourne Legacy Club was expanding and the need for adequate facilities was urgent. The funds for this major change had a "kick-start" with the large bequest from the Dureau family in memory of a son killed in WWII. For the first time, Melbourne Legacy went "public" for financial assistance. The Melbourne "Age" got behind this, by sending photographers to all Junior Legacy activities, Boys' Classes, Girls' Classes, Residences, Camps and Holidays and so on, and then published a complete whole page of the Legacy "scene", calling for help by the public. Some £90,000 was raised in all and with the Dureau bequest the present Legacy House was purchased and fitted out, with the first and second floors largely for Girls' Classes, plus the weekly luncheon of Legatees. A small set of offices was on the third floor with a large area for the new Dental Clinic, where all Junior Legatees were able to have free dental treatment.

Two Legatees heavily involved in all this were Bob Gaylard, the 1956 President and the late John Lobb, a leading architect eventually to be President in 1962.

After our two very talkative meetings we were given a very interesting talk by a representative from Customs and a showing of all items used for drug detection. Altogether a lovely day.

MAKING SURE YOU'RE SAFE Install a Smoke Alarm in Your Home


Fires happen at any time, in any home. You need to ensure you're prepared in case the "unthinkable" happens to you. Installing smoke alarms provides an early warning by waking you and giving that vital time needed to get out safely.

The Country Fire Authority's Community Risk Manager, David Owen, advises that a properly installed and maintained smoke alarm is a very necessary piece of household equipment. Householders need to make sure their alarms are working properly.

- Check regularly. Make sure the batteries are working by testing the alarm weekly. You
 can do this by pushing the test button with a broom handle to ensure it beeps.
- A "cheep cheep" noise from the alarm means that the batteries are flat. They need to be replaced immediately. Some people remove the batteries and forget to replace them. Doing it straight away will reduce your chances of forgetting to install new ones. David gives the following tips. But if you have any difficulty with any of these, ask a family member, a friend, or a carer to help.
- Replace the batteries at least once a year. A good time to do this is at daylight saving change over. Remember. "Change your clock, change your smoke alarm battery".
- Clean your smoke alarm regularly by vacuuming it. This will keep dust and other material away from the smoke alarm's sensors and allow it to work properly.

A smoke alarm should be installed outside each sleeping area. If you sleep with your door closed, a smoke alarm should be installed in your bedroom. Occupants of multi-storey homes should install a smoke alarm on each level. All smoke alarms should be linked together so that if one goes off they all go off. Smoke alarms are very affordable and an Australian Standards alarm can be bought for as little as \$10. Smoke alarms are available at hardware stores, electrical stores and many supermarkets.

HEALTH PROMOTION SEMINAR

TESTING FOR DIABETES

<u>Date</u> - 22nd August <u>Where</u> - Legacy House <u>Time</u> - 11.30am.

On this day Meredith Williamson "The Health Educator" will advise you on how to recognise if you have diabetes and she will test each widow.

The test is a simple prick of the finger and the blood is tested immediately and you will be told the result. 



- the telephone rings...
- the kettle whistles...
- the smoke alarm is triggered...
- the alarm clock sounds...
- the baby cries...

They are identified by a bright-orange collar and lead and have an identity card with a photo of the dog and the Hearing Dog logo on it. This card is proof of the owner's right to take their dog into public places such as restaurants, theatres, shopping centres and public



transport. (Hearing Dogs are trained quite differently from Guide Dogs for Blind People, but they have the same access rights).



Key Messages For Your Safety as a Pedestrian

MAKING YOUR ROAD CROSSING EASIER AND SAFER

- Wherever possible, cross at traffic lights or on a marked pedestrian crossing
- If you cannot cross at traffic lights or on a pedestrian crossing, try to cross where there is a median strip or a refuge in the middle of the road.




- When crossing a road divided by a median strip or refuge, concentrate on the traffic immediately to your right. When it is clear, make your way to the median/refuge in the centre of the road and complete your crossing when there is not traffic to your left.
- Avoid crossing undivided roads (without a median or refuge), as you may have to cross up to
 4 lanes of traffic or you may have to stop in the middle of the road.

MAKING YOURSELF MORE VISIBLE

- Avoid crossing between or behind parked cars on hills or bends, as drivers may not see you and you may not have clear view of approaching traffic
- Make eye contact with the drivers of approaching vehicles, especially those who are making right or left hand turns
- Wear bright clothing and/or accessories (wrist band, scarf, bag, or umbrella). Orange, red, yellow and white are bright colours; avoid wearing black, navy, grey, brown and green as these are full and difficult to see.

EXPECT THE UNEXPECTED

- Keep looking around you while crossing the road, be alert.
- When crossing at intersections, make eye contact with drivers of turning vehicles. Never assume a driver has seen you.



REDUCING YOUR TIME ON THE ROAD

- Walk straight across the road by the shortest most direct route
- Plan the safest route. This may not necessarily be the guickest
- Where possible, plan your outings around the quiet time of the day, between 10.00am and 3.00pm.
- If it is busy or you do not feel safe crossing the road, ask for assistance. Most people are pleased to assist.

LEAVE AT LEAST 1 INCH OF PAPER AROUND THE STAMP

This way we can open them out and still obtain the required amount round the stamp.

The unfranked ones, (those not cancelled by the Post office), are checked, then made into bundles of 200. For those with 1 inch of paper around we are paid 45% face value.

Those that have been cancelled are sold by weight, so by cutting them too close we lose money. To be cleaned they must be soaked in hot water then spread out to dry for 2 days. WILLS

In the February edition of "THE ANSWER", an article suggesting a review of insurance policies and wills mentioned The Trust Company of Australia as preparing or updating wills at little or no cost. The Trust Company has subsequently advised that it now charges \$125 for a single and \$200 for a couple for the preparation of wills. Melbourne Legacy's advice is that if you are thinking of preparing or updating your will you should shop around and find out:-



- (1) What you will be charged to prepare the will

WWI VETS SET UP SCHOLARSHIP FUND

A fund to provide tertiary study scholarships for the descendants of World War I veterans has been launched by the First War Veterans' Association of NSW. The Minister for Veterans' Affairs, Bruce Scott presented a cheque for \$4,000 to the president of the association, Lew Howell on behalf of the Federal Government. Mr Scott said it was hoped the scholarship would rekindle and keep alive the memory of the 324,00 Australians who volunteered to serve in World War I.

The Gallipoli Scholarship Fund Inc. aims to raise a quarter of a million dollars by June 1997. Income from the fund will be used to provide scholarships for tertiary study for Australian citizens who are lineal descendants of World War I Australian servicemen or women. The scholarships will cover all States and will be awarded annually. It is hoped the first scholarships will be awarded in 1998.



"See here young lass just you behave" said my mother dear "I've given permission to those people to clip you over the ear"












Legacy's 66th Annual ANZAC Commemoration Ceremony for Students

MEDICATION: Check with your doctor whether your medical condition or any medication you may be taking can affect your driving. Remember - legal may be lethal! You need to understand your medication.

EYES AND EARS: Have regular hearing and eye tests. Wear your glasses. Sunglasses help in bright sunshine.

DON'T DRIVE IF YOU ARE:

- Tired;
- Upset; or
- Under the influence of alcohol

BE EXTRA CAUTIOUS BY:

- Always wearing your Seatbelt;
- Planning your turns well ahead; and
- Checking that if the vehicle in front passed a point along the road, it would take you at least 3 to 4 seconds to reach the same point.





PRESCRIPTIONS

PHARMACEUTICAL BENEFITS FOR CONCESSIONAL CARD HOLDERS

Concessional card holders are now required to pay a minimum patient contribution of \$3.20 for each prescription item. A surcharge is applicable where a more expensive brand has been prescribed.

To compensate for the \$3.20 patient contribution, a Pharmaceutical Allowance of \$5.40 is paid with the pension each fortnight.

Patients should consult with their physician, as to whether their prescription is for the generic brand of medicine, (thus attracting the charge of \$3.20) or, whether it is a premium brand which incurs a higher cost to the patient. In

most cases the pharmacist will dispense the generic brand if requested, by the patient, provided the doctor has not ticked the "no substitution" box on the form, but it is desirable to discuss this before they commence to dispense the prescription.



A safety net scheme operates, to protect patients who require a large number of PBS items in any one calendar year. When the patient reaches the safety net threshold (of 52 prescriptions) in a <u>calendar year</u> then any further medication is dispensed less the \$3.20 charge for the remainder of that calendar year.

INFLUENZA IMMUNISATION - 1997 Enjoy a Flu Free Winter

Advice from the Department of Human Services

If you are 65 years or older, you should be immunised every year. A new initiative of the Department of Human Services will be to provide the influenza vaccine free of charge this year for people aged 65 years or older. The past practice of having to go to a doctor for a prescription, obtain the vaccine from a chemist and then return to the doctor to have the vaccine administered will be made easier. Vaccines will be issued to doctors throughout the State and will be administered to people 65 years or older. You are in the influenza high risk group if you are 65 years or older, living in a nursing home, or are any age and have troublesome asthma, a heart or lung condition, kidney or liver disease, diabetes or lowered immunity.

You should be immunised each year against influenza and the best time is in the autumn months between the beginning of March and the end of May. You should go to your doctor or Community Health Centre and ask to be immunised if you are in the high risk group, even if you feel healthy. Don't wait to be asked - get in early and request your flu vaccine now and enjoy a flu free winter. (Medical fees for immunisation may still be applicable). # Mr Alf Young of Ickenham Middlesex

It is with regret that we report the death of Alf in early January. He was 85.

Legacy had our first contact with Alf in May 1993. A friend had shown him a copy of our newsletter from May 1992, and he wrote to us about the ANZAC cemetery close to Harefield Hospital which was the first ANZAC hospital during the Great War. There are 111 ANZACs buried there and one nurse. Annual ANZAC services at that cemetery commenced in 1918, and the first school parade of local school children attended by Alf and his sisters was held in 1921. Since contacting Legacy directly, Alf laid a wreath of poppies at the Cenotaph on ANZAC day on Legacy's behalf. The annual ANZAC ceremony involving local school children continues to this day. In


### "Poppy"O'Neill Celebrates Her 100th Birthday



### A Visit to Gallipoli

With a feeling of wonder, sorrow, interest and awe, I found myself on the 3rd day of my recent tour, to Turkey about to visit Gallipoli. GALLIPOLI, a word, a name, a place, so familiar to so many Australians, particularly me, since my marriage, as my father-in-law, the late Henry Edward Miller, No.455, 24th Battalion, was in 1915, wounded and lost his right eye, at Gallipoli. Official records show, "Gun shot wounds, Right Eye, transferred to Alexandra."

It was a bright sunny morning, the 25th September, as we travelled from Asian Istanbul, across the Golden Horn to European Istanbul, the largest city in the world to stand on two continents. We travelled, northwest and then south on the north shore of the Marmara Sea, to Gallipoli and the cliffs overlooking the Dardanelles.

Our visit took us first to Lone Pine, then on to the NZ Memorial and lastly to the Turkish Memorial.

Lone Pine, the large memorial is in the process of repair and a lot of pines were recently burned in a bush fire, but the Cemetery itself is very beautiful and a Pine, stands alone at the centre. I took several photographs and as I wandered, I wondered about the young men, who had travelled so far, to a strange land, with my father-on-law, Harry, all those years ago. Deciding to photograph one of the Headstones, I stopped, then took a pace back, I remembered that I had seen the age on one, just nineteen, the same age as Harry. There, in front of me, was, "PRIVATE A.W. MILLAN 456, 24th Btn. 29th November, 1915, age 19". What a similarity! Harry was wounded on 19th November, the same Btn, the names so similar, BUT the NUMBER. These 2 boys had stood together, somewhere in Melbourne, to enlist. Young, excited and probably anxious for action, something of which they knew so little. One paid the Supreme Sacrifice, the other returned, minus his right eye, to raise a family of four sons, all of whom served overseas and returned from the Second World War, to raise families of their own. You may only imagine my feelings, as I stood above Anzac Cove, on that warm September day in 1996.

If anyone out there, knows anyone, who might be related to A.W. Millan, please contact me and I will be happy to give them the photographs.
