For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty during the retirement of refugees from Sain Qaleh to Tikkan Tappah between the 26th and 28th July 1918 also at Chalkaman on 5th and 6th August, 1918. In command of a small party sent to protect the rear of the column of refugees, he by his energy, resource, and able dispositions the hostile troops, many of whom were mounted were kept at a distance although in greatly superior force. He hung onto position after position until nearly surrounded, and on each occasion extricated his command most skilfully. His cool determination and fine example under fire inspired his men, and put heart into the panic of the stricken refugees".
