

J.J Savage Memorial Trophy.

The J. J. Savage Memorial Trophy was donated by brothers John Blennherhassett Savage and Thomas Joseph Savage both of Williamstown Victoria. The brothers were desirous of perpetuating the memory of their father the late John Joseph Savage.

Their trophy, to be known as the J.J Savage Memorial Trophy, was offered as the Perpetual Trophy for the Victorian Championship of International Dragon Class yachts.

The first 'friendly' competition for the trophy was in 1952/53 and was won by Kamulla, KA 9, sailed by A.S (Jock) Sturrock and C Patience of the Royal Brighton Yacht Club. Sturrock followed up by winning five of the next six championships, in Kamulla, Paula KA 30 and Nan II KA 60, respectively. Sturrock also became a Prince Philip Cup winner, an Australian Olympian and Americas Cup helmsman.

Other notable winners have been '64 Olympian Graham Drane in Paula and Cambria, Denmarks Borge Borresen who along with James Sim from Geelong, introduced the first fibreglass Dragon to Australia; Paul Mellody and Guyon Wilson both 4 time winners, Stephen Boyes, a Tasmanian sailing the imported Petticrows, Krystle, who went on to win the 91 Dragon World Championship and 14 time winner Tony Moody, in Tickle Me, Abracadabra and Amazing Grace
