- 3. BookMobile to still function at this time.
 - Mrs. J. Aird moved that we write to Lilydale Librarian, Mrs. Pivic, and request that when the Bookmobile hours are being reviewed that the hours at Wonga Park be extended so as to start at 3-30 p.m. instead of 5.30 p.m. This would allow the achoolchildren to use the bookmobile on their way home from school. - 4. Brushy Creek drainage,.. Meeting held with Councillors, Minister of Supply and local M. Ps. Noney not available now. Next meeting with Croydon Council and Mr. J. Mann to be held later this month.
- 5. Cr. A. LeeArcher has given notice of motion re allowing more than 2 dogs per property that is more than 2 hectares complying to certain restrictions. Motion has been defferred to be considered.
 - Mr. J. Upton moved that we request the council to refuse any application for permission to keep more than 2 dogs per property in Wonga Park. Seconded by R. Hodgson.... carried.

Mr. T. VanWegberg moved that the secretary when notifying the Council of this motion include the voting figures of 3 in favour of motion and 2 against. Seconded by J. Buist.... motion lost.

Mrs. J. Aird moved that the next meeting of this Assoc. be held in the Community Cottage on Wednesday, July 8th., and the following 2 meetings be held in the Cottage. Seconded by R. Yerke, ... carried.

General Business cont.

J. Buist that we write to Council to suggest that the Bus shelter on the corner of Yarra and Homestead Roads be moderfied to include clear persplex panels. Seconded by L. Hicklingcarried.

Mr. J. Kenwright moved that we contact the S.E.C. and complain about the numerous blackouts that occur in this district, in particular, Toppings Road. Seconded by P. Fallon carried.

Mr. R. Yorke reported that neighbours of his have moved into an unfinished house not approved by Council . Cr. A. Smith reported that the Council is at present attending to this matter.

Cr. A. Smith reported that council has given much thought and discussion into the po ssibility of imposing building restrictions in Wonga Park e.g. Brick homes only, and decided against this idea due to the diversity of the area.
