4(11) The Minister for Local Government Mp. L. Leiberman met with Hersfield, the Council and the Soliciter General resulting in a direction to Hersfield that they present to Council, within one month, plans showing the library, theatres etc. using the 10 metre set back. The Minister, will however, consider other alternatives that fall within the zoning. Any new recreational facilities (not duplication of existing facilities) may be considered. The library is to be built first and to include community facilities. The Minister will be the sole arbitrator of objections.

4(111) YARRA BRAE

Negotiations between Mr. Bisset-Johnson and the Government have been taking place with the aim of the Government purchasing some land along the river frontage. The Planning and Conservation Ministers as well as the EPA and Soil Conservation are also involved. Resolved that letters be sent to the Minister for Local Government and the Hon.
