BUSINESS ARISING: Mr. Mackie telephoned to accept invitation to October meeting. Margaret Fankhauser spoke of a need for a public phone in the shopping centre. The meeting emphasised the need to display in a prominent position in News & Notes the October meeting date when Mr. Mackie will attend to speak on issues relating to Telecom. It was felt we should get a more widely represented group at the meeting.

COUNCILLOR'S REPORT: \$800,000 Hawthory Rd. Pool. Heated. West & South share cost equally. Council expecting a public meeting to protest about new site for netball courts in Mooroolbark. Council considering new by-laws in relation to burning off. Jean Aird moved that the Councillor's Report be accepted, seconded by Frank Barr - carried.

GENERAL BUSINESS: Jean Aird moved that we write to Croydon Council congratulating them on the planned reconstruction of Wonga Road from Warranwood Road to Reid's Lane and asking for a copy of completed plans of intersection. Jean Aird spoke on landscaping around the hall and the danger of dead trees. Cr. Glenister feels that there will be funding in future estimates for maintenance. Road work should commence anytime and expected to be completed within a month on Yarra Road between Jumping Creek Road and fire station. Jean Aird requested gravel for parking opposite cottage. Cr. Glenister looking into this. Margaret Fankhauser asked Cr. Glenister about the possibility of a footpath from Inverbervie Crt. to shops, also a footpath through Council land to Vine Cres. Older people are finding the terrain rough. Cr. Glenister to look into these matters and suggested that residents of Toppings Road write to Council re footpath.
