3. MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING:

5. CORRESPONDENCE:

i. Incoming

7. COUNCILLOR REPORT:

No Councillor was present

8. GENERAL BUSINESS:

Jean Aird raised the following points:

- i. The problems that may be caused by the large rubbish wheelie bins due to be introduced in October. She was most concerned that little thought had been given to the difficulties likely to be experienced by elderly or disabled residents, especially those with steep or long driveways. Also of concern was who would be responsible for the replacement cost if a bin is stolen or damaged.
- ii. Since the reconstruction of sections of Yarra Road the fog lines have not been replaced.
- iii. Rabbits are breeding in the blackberries at the western side of the western oval. What can be done to kill the blackberries and reduce the rabbits?
- iv. What restrictions are there on the use of firearms in Wonga Park?

There was a meeting of the Jumping Creek Road Resident Working Group on Thursday, December 16. Issues discussed were:

- a. Police have agreed to regularly use detection devices to control speeding.
- b. Large warning signs at each end of Jumping Creek Road and also somewhere centrally.
- c. Drainage. Some properties allow surface water collected on their driveways to spill on to Jumping Creek Road causing cars to aquaplane.
- d. Drains along the Doncaster-Templestowe section often overflow on to the roadway.
- e. Round-a-bout is still required to solve the Yarra/Dudley Roads intersection. However yellow speed bars may be used in the interim.
- f. Crests either side of the intersection still need treatment.

Concern was expressed about the reconstruction of the recently constructed car park next to the Wonga Park Primary School. The Mark 3 version has just been completed. How much rate payers' money has been wasted and who is responsible for the apparent incompetence?
