RAINFALL

In June 62.50 mm (2.50 inches) of rain were recorded making the total for the year to the end of July 378 mm (15.12 inches).

Although we have had nearly 3.0 inches of rain in January the total rain recorded for the first four months was only 162 mm (6.48 inches). In May, June and July we had 216 mm (8.64 inches).
