WONGA PARK RESIDENTS' ASSOCIATION

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

on Friday 11 May 1990 at 8.00 pm in the Community Cottage

The Residents' Association Annual General Meeting is usually held on the second Friday in April. This year it falls on Good Friday and for this reason the AGM (and the monthly meeting) have been postponed to the second Friday in May. Consideration was given to simply postponing the meeting by a week, but this would have put it in the school holidays and prevented several people from attending.

YARRA ROAD RECONSTRUCTION

The plans for the reconstruction of Yarra Road were displayed at our last meeting and at the Community Cottage Barbeque. These plans show a saving of a substantial clump of trees near and to the south of Beagley's that we believed would have to go, but the loss of another clump further to the south that we thought could be saved. This time the road cannot simply be moved to the west as the local SEC power supply is underground beneath the high voltage transmission lines. Also the plans show a partial straightening of the road at the Dawes Road corner by the acquisition of a substantial piece of land from the property opposite. The Association has written to the Council commending it on the plans, but requesting consideration be given to fine tuning the plans to try to save some of the clump of trees at the southern end.

COMMUNITY COTTAGE BARBEQUE

The Committee of the Community Cottage is to be commended for the celebration barbeque they put on in the carpark outside the cottage. Everyone who attended thoroughly enjoyed themselves and it was a great opportunity for residents to get together.

WONGA PARK OVERALL DEVELOPMENT PLAN

The Council has prepared an updated overall development plan which shows all the "village area" of Wonga Park north of Jumping Creek Road as having a minimum lot size of 0.4 hectare (1 acre) and about half the area to the south of Jumping Creek Road with a minimum lot size of 0.2 hectare $(\frac{1}{2}$ acre) and the balance 0.4 hectare. At present the MMBW requirement is for any new unsewered lot in this area to have a 0.4 minimum size. The Association has written to the Council requesting the whole area have a minimum of 0.4 hectare to bring it in line with the MMBW requirement (as sewerage will not be available for the foreseeable future) and to avoid any misunderstanding by potential purchasers.
