RESIDENTS' ASSOCIATION

At the Annual General Meeting of the Association held on Friday 11 May 1990 the following were elected: Chairman - Philip Glenister, Secretary - Michael Tapper, Treasurer - Barry Box.

The Association is grateful to the outgoing chairman - Lynda Hickling and outgoing Treasurer - Esma Barr, for their contribution over the past year and also to Barry Box who retired as Secretary, but will continue his involvement in the Association as Treasurer.

Subscriptions and Sponsorships for WP&DRA

All members of the Residents' Association are reminded that subscriptions (still only \$5.00 per family) are now due and can be paid at any meeting or forwarded to the Treasurer - Barry Box. Meetings are held on the second Friday of each month. Subscriptions are used to pay the rental of the Cottage for meetings and to cover the cost of printing News & Notes. Also, any private person is able to sponsor an edition of News & Notes for the cost of \$20.00, which provides an acknowledgement of their sponsorship and a brief advertisement.

BLACKWOOD DRIVE RESERVE

Unfortunately we ran out of time at the last Residents' Assoc meeting and discussion of the Council's proposed development plan for this reserve was postponed to the June meeting. The Council has asked for the opinion of the Association in planning and design of the Reserve.

DEVELOPMENT IN WONGA PARK

The owner of Beagley's Store has agreed to provide temporary shoring at the rear of the store to prevent subsidence of land from neighbouring properties. A consultant's report prepared on behalf of the owner of Post Office Store has been lodged with the Lilydale Council in support of development of residential land adjacent to the P.O. Store. The report also supports relocation of existing retail floor space from Beagley's store to the proposed site next to the P.O. Store.

The report is not a formal application for rezoning of land. discusses the Wonga Park area and suggests that more retail floor space is needed. The report has been listed for consideration at the Lilydale Council's West Riding Meeting on 18 June. Council have not made any decision on the report at this stage and has advised that it will take into consideration all previous correspondence, including the recent petition opposing further commercial development, prior to deciding on any response to the report.

Those who attended the last Meeting of the Residents' Association were given a draft copy of the proposed Constitution. Although the Association originally had a Constitution a number of years ago, it has been mislaid. At the next Meeting the new draft will be discussed and, hopefully, a final document can be agreed upon.

BLUE CROSS

Council has now approved the construction of a factory type building over the kennels, subject to EPA approval, to reduce the noise of its barking dogs.

PAINFALL
