The Council has reminded us that a permit is required to ride trail bikes on private property. The permit limits the times during which the bike can be used and the rider(s) must be nominated in the permit,

CNR JUMPING CREEK & YARRA ROADS

The pine post barriers erected behind the bus shelter on this corner were put there by the Council at the request of a resident concerned at the number of vehicles driving across the grass. Council has now agreed to reposition the barrier to allow a semicircular track to be used, at the same time still restricting vehicles from driving on the grass. This piece of land used to be the old Yarra Road roadway and is a roadside reserve.

OVERALL DEVELOPMENT PLAN

The ODP for Wonga Park will be the subject of a panel hearing on 10 September 1990. The panel will hear from those who have lodged written submissions and objections before deciding on the final proposal. The ODP will form the basis of all future decisions that Council makes on zoning issues and subdivisions in the area in the future. The Upper Yarra Valley and Dandenong Ranges Authority are also currently in the process of re-examining the area.

WHERE ARE THE WILDFLOWERS OF WONGA PARK?

Chocolate Lilies, Early Nancies, Milkmalds, Nodding Greenhoods, Scented Sundews, Apple Berries etc were once abundant, and children walking to school in Wonga Park years ago, would have known and loved them well.

Now, these treasures are to be found only in isolated remnants of bushland or on private property. Indigenous plants on roadsides are threatened by weed invasion and haphazard parking of vehicles etc.

Fortunately, this has, at last, been recognized by the Shire of Lillydale and some work, designed to protect indigenous vegetation, has begun at Wonga Park Reserve.

But community support is needed for the success of this venture.

Joanne Lambden, Landscape Development Officer with the Shire has expressed her willingness to meet a group of people interested in helping with management strategies such as weeding and seed collection.
