## RESIDENTS' ASSOCIATION

On behalf of the Residents' Association, I would like to thank Kerry Taushke who has decided to step down as Editor of News & Notes after considerable service. Her help and skills over the past few years have been greatly appreciated.

The Annual General Meeting of the Residents' Association will be held prior to the normal April Meeting on Friday 12 April 1991 8.00pm at the Community Cottage. As always, there is an open invitation to residents to come along and participate, with the annual membership fee remaining at \$5.00 per family per year. Fresh blood on the Committe is always needed and appreciated.

The March meeting will be held at the Cottage 8.00pm on 8 March 1991 and a limited number of the booklets 'A History of Wonga Park' are on sale for \$5.00 at the meetings.

Reconstruction of Yarra Rd between St John's Rd and Dawes Rd has finally started, as per the signs erected a couple of weeks ago, but I don't like the chances of it being completed by the date showing on the signs. Anyone that has to use Yarra Rd daily will will be extremely grateful when this overdue reconstruction is finally completed. Launders Avenue will be sealed shortly following requests from residents who the majority of which, much to the Shire's surprise, are not objecting to the financial contributions required. A small grant has also been obtained from Vic Roads to assist with the costs involved.

Announcements of applications for increased use of land for commercial purposes will be appearing within the next month as the Shire has accepted a proposal for the purposes of exhibition from the owner of the Store on the corner of Jumping Creek Rd and Dudley Rd and an alternative proposal from the owners of the Goodfellows shops. Given the reassurrances that we have had from the Shire in the past, it is dissapointing that they have now conceeded to examine proposals for all three shop sites, including possible development on the Beagley's site.

The Wonga Park Overall Development Plan, which was examined by an independent review panel last year, has been abandoned. The panel concluded that the ODP was too limited, in that it only looked at residential land in an area in the centre of the township and did not address the issue of future commercial or recreational use. These issues were considered to be already adequately covered by existing zoning and planning provisions.

The Met is carrying out a survey of the transport needs of residents in the Outer East and the Shire's response to this survey will strongly support extension of the existing bus service to the Wonga Park area.

Residents of Ryland Crt (off Brushy Park Rd) have approached the Shire with a proposal to purchase the land set aside in their street for recreational purposes. There are numerous similar blocks dotted around Wonga Park that are the result of a requirement of developers who subdivide land to provide a proportion of the development to be set aside for recreational purposes.

The Shire is currently compiling a data base covering Council owned reserves which will provide an inventory of each site and its physical assets (flora and fauna). This database could assist in community tree plantings etc.. in identifying the extent and type of indigenous plants and trees in particular reserves.

More community tree planting days are planned during arbor week for the area behind the bus shelter at the corner of Jumping Creek and Yarra Roads, and for Penderal reserve.

New playground equipment has been installed in the playground area next to the Wonga Park Hall, and revegetation of the area following the recent tree planting program is coming along. Unfortunately, until the plants grow to a more hardy size, most of the area around the hall has to be hand mown. The recently installed fences also make the area much harder to keep maintained.
