Rainfall

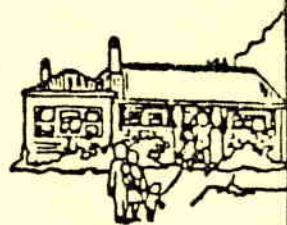

### A Community House is:

- A place where people share or gain skills and knowledge, in an atmosphere of equality and flexibility.
- A place where you can come to know and belong to your community.

### What they may contain:

- Occasional Child Care
- Personal Development Classes
- School Holiday Programs
- H. S. C. Subjects
- Playgroups
- Discussion Groups
- Toy Libraries
- Support Groups
- Big Variety of Classes
- Workshops
- Outreach Groups

- Volunteer Projects

### Where are they located:

Community Houses operate from a house or hall provided by a local Council or other group.

### When are they Open:

Community Houses operate during the day, evening and weekends, with child-care available on weekdays.



### Who runs them:

Houses have a Co-ordinator. The buildings are managed by an independent Committee of Management.

They rely on the ideas, efforts and support of a great many people, (mostly volunteers) - so users are encouraged to participate in the running of the house and become involved in a variety of projects or in management areas.

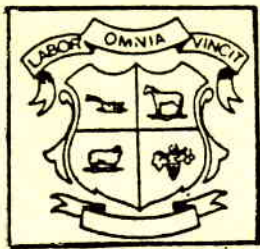

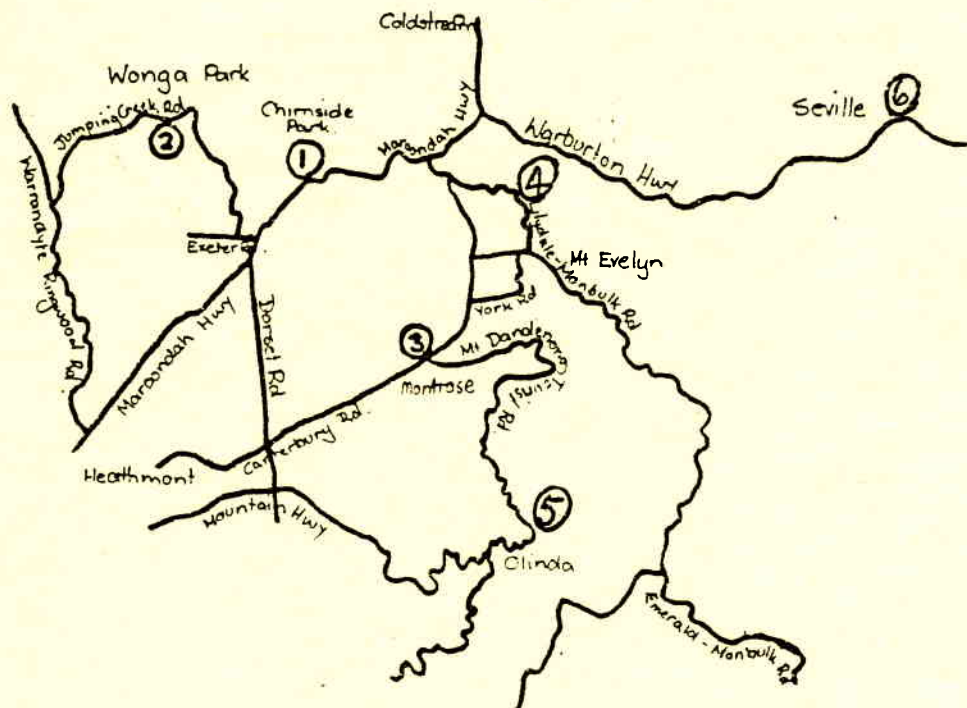
