POWER SUPPLY

The Customer Service and Operations Manager of the SEC at Ringwood, Mr John Ward, attended our December meeting and gave us an interesting overview of how mains power is reticulated to the Wonga Park area. John also explained the reasons for the many power outages we experienced in the area at the end of last year.

The SEC are well aware of power supply problems in Wonga Park and John explained the ways in it is attempting to ascertain the cause. Whilst we realise that we live in a heavily treed area and that this leads to some problems with falling branches and trees, there are many other possible sources of power interruption.

John stressed that it is essential for the SEC to be contacted by any resident that notices a flash somewhere outside immediately before a power outage. The SEC would also like to hear from anyone that experiences dimming of lights or brief drops in the level of power supply. This seems to be a common problem in the area but the SEC need to know precisely when and where this is occuring before they are able to isolate the cause.
