Please note that there will be no March Meeting.


Membership in the Residents Association remains at \$5.00 per family per year, although non-financial residents are always welcome to attend meetings, join in discussion and vote.

As well as electing a Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer at the Annual General Meeting, volunteers to be Editor of future editions of News & Notes will also be invited.








