SUMMER BUS TIMETABLE

Invicta will introduce additional services through Wonga Park during the Summer School holidays, from Monday, 21st December 1992 to Friday, 22nd January 1993. the changes are in response to Invicta's recent survey.

The patronage effects of the change will be compared against other patronage figures and will hopefully justify retention of the service into 1993. However the PTC must approve any permanent expansion of the service.

ILLEGAL DUMPING OF RUBBISH

MONTHLY RAINFALL

In November 136.50 mm (5.46 inches) of rain were recorded bringing the total for the first eleven months of the year to 918 mm (36.72 inches). It has been a wet Spring with the rainfall for the three months of Spring being 450 mm (18.00 inches).


