WE THINK IT IS!

- IT IS THESE INTRINSIC NATURAL FEATURES WHICH HAVE ATTRACTED MANY RESIDENTS AND VISITORS TO THIS PICTURESQUE REGION.
- THE WONGA PARK ENVIRONMENTAL GROUP HAS BEEN WORKING TOWARD ACHIEVING THESE AIMS OVER THE PAST COUPLE OF YEARS.
- MANY VOLUNTEER HOURS HAVE BEEN PUT INTO REVEGETATION/ REMOVAL OF ENVIRONMENTAL WEEDS/ RUBBISH REMOVAL/ LOBBYING LOCAL GOVT. AND STATE AUTHORITIES.
- YOU WILL NOTICE THE INTRODUCTION OF NEW S.E.C. AERIAL BUNDLED CABLING TO THE WONGA PARK AREA WHICH WILL ALLOW NEW STREETSCAPE DESIGN WITH INCREASED FIRE SAFETY PERFORMANCE.
 - WE ARE NOW WORKING WITH THE SHIRES NEW CONSERVATION OFFICER AND ARE LINKED TO MANY ORGANIZATIONS.
 - WE CAN OFFER ADVICE AND EXPERTISE TO RESIDENTS INTERESTED IN SAVING OR ENHANCING REMNANT BUSH ON PRIVATE OR PUBLIC LANDS.
- MANY OF OUR PLANT AND ANIMAL SPECIES ARE AT RISK IN THIS REGION. HABITAT REPLACEMENT AND ENHANCEMENT IS OF MAJOR BENEFITIAL EFFECT. GROWING LOCAL INDIGENOUS SPECIES ENCOURAGES BIRDS AND OTHER WILDLIFE INTO OUR GARDENS.
- PROPAGATION IS PRESENTLY UNDERWAY OF INDIGENOUS SPECIES GROWN FROM LOCALLY COLLECTED SEED AND CUTTINGS. THESE
 WILL BECOME AVAILABLE TO RESIDENTS THROUGH COUPERS ORCHARD STORE (FREYNE ST.) IN THE NEAR FUTURE.
- OVER THE PAST DECADE MANY OF WONGA PARKS UNIQUE BUSHLAND LANDSCAPES HAVE DISAPPEARED AS DEVELOPMENT TOGETHER
 WITH THE LACK OF AN OVERALL CONSERVATION POLICY HAVE TAKEN THEIR TOLL.
 - ANOTHER 10 YEARS OF THE SAME STRATEGY WILL BE TOO LATE AND WE WILL BE WORKING TOWARDS PUTTING IN PLACE A
 MANAGABLE CONSERVATION PLAN FOR THE WONGA PARK AREA.
