LAUNDERS AVENUE

After the concern of local residents last year about the over pruning of trees near power lines the SEC has installed bundled cables (which can safely pass through trees) in several streets and have put the power lines underground in the western part of Launders Avenue near the Reserve.

On Sunday the 5th October the SEC, representatives from the Shire of Lilydale and local residents will meet to plant out the strip of land along the nature strip in Launders Avenue, laid bare by the putting of the power lines underground. RAW SEWAGE IN JUMPING CREEK

Local residents have reported to the resident's association that they saw raw sewage floating down Jumping Creek downstream of Melbourne Water's pumping station early in August after heavy rains. The Association has written to Melbourne Water to confirm if a spill from the pumping station did occur then and if so to advise what action is being taken to avoid any further spills.
