## TALKS ABOUT BUSHLAND

More than 270 private properties in the shire include valuable bushland registered as sites of natural significance under the Regional Strategy Plan.

Hundreds of other people live next to public reserves which are valuable habitats to a wide variety of animal and plant species.

The Upper Yarra Valley and Dandénong Ranges Environmental Council is striving to help land owners manage and appreciate the value of their remnant bushland. It will run a free workshop on sites of natural significance at Lillydale Lake on Saturday, May 7, from 9a.m.

Topics will include the value of remnant bushland, birds and insects of the area, management of bushland and how to attract native animals to your property.

This is the seventh workshop run by the environmental council for land owners in the Yarra Valley and Dandenongs.

# JUMPING CREEK ROAD RESIDENT WORKING GROUP REPORT ADOPTED BY COUNCIL

The efforts of Jumping Creek Road Resident Working Group members have culminated in a draft report which has now been adopted by the Shire of Lillydale.

Residents may recall that as a result of last year's Wonga Park Public Consultation meeting, a resident working group was formed by Council to address the various traffic issues raised by residents regarding the function and operation of Jumping Creek Road, Wonga Park.

The Working Group has since met regularly, and last month presented its report to the West Riding Committee of the Shire of Lillydale. The report outlined the Group's activities and categorised the various issues into short-term, medium-term and long-term depending on funding implications and/or the need for wider public consultation.

In adopting the Working Group's recommendations, The West Riding Committee and full Council has allocated funds within the current budget year for the following works:

- \* Installation of large graphic advisory signs designed to highlight the dangerous nature of the road at the following locations:
  - (i) 50 metres east of Hartley Road (2 signs)
  - ii) Double sided sign on the northern road reserve between No's 218 and 204 Jumping Creek Road
- \* Installation of smaller signs at the fatality locations:
  - (iii) 400 metres east of Hooper Road (2 signs)
  - (iv) 270 metres west of Hartley Road (2 signs)
- \* Installation of truck overturning warning sign in Jumping Creek Road on the west side of Dudley Road
- \* Installation of yellow raised awareness bars in Jumping Creek Road on the west side of Dudley Road (on the crest) for east-bound traffic.

While these works (totalling an estimated \$4,600) are to be carried out as soon as possible, Council also resolved that the medium-term improvements detailed in the report be budgetted for implementation during the 1994/95 budget year.

As recommended by the Working Group, Council will also approach the City of Doncaster & Templestowe requesting the installation of two (large advisory) signs 50 metres east of Potters Cottage, and a "fatality" sign each side of the bridge.

Council will shortly notify affected residents accordingly and include a copy of the Working Group's complete recommendations. In the meantime should you wish any further information please contact Lucynda Baggio at the Shire Offices on telephone 735 8333.

9.30am - 12.30pm. If anyone has a couple of hours to spare especially Wed afternoons it would be most appreciated.


