#### OBITUARY ALBERT AIRD

Former Wonga Park orchardist and a leading participant in many service organisations in the area. Born 5 November, 1913 on a Ringwood orchard located where the Eastland Shopping Centre now stands. Died 2 August 1995 aged 81 years at Don-Wood Nursing Home surrounded by his family. His widow Jean is still an active and involved member of the Wonga Park community.

Albert was very much an individualist and a very active man. He loved walking and he and Jean were prominent members of the Melbourne Walking Club. Winter did not deter them and they donned skis and became enthusiastic cross-country skiers during the 1930's. Albert's love for the high country was reflected in his membership of the Mountain Cattlemen's Association.

Albert's diversity of interests were impressive, an accountant by profession, he rose to senior executive

level in the finance area of Mobil Oil Australia. During the 1960's he purchased a cherry orchard on Yarra Road in Wonga Park.

Albert's involvement in community affairs was broad and deep. Charter member of the Lions' Club of Ringwood, President of the Board of Management of the Ringwood Technical School, helped form the 6th Ringwood Scout Group, Treasurer of the group of people who built the Dickson Crescent, Uniting (Methodist) Church, North Ringwood. And when John Upton asked Albert to join the Wonga Park & District Residents' Association he did and fulfilled the roles of President, Secretary and Editor of 'New & Notes' at various times over the years. Also he was a member of the Wonga Park Hall Committee.

Both Albert and Jean have been staunch supporters of both the Association and community of Wonga Park and for many years were the mainstay of this Association. Albert's efforts are still greatly appreciated and he will be sorely missed. The Wonga Park & Districts Residents' Association send their condolences to his widow Jean, their children and grandchildren.

## **WONGA PARK UPDATE**

The transition of Wonga Park to the new City of Manningham is well under way. As with any move there will be issues which need to be addressed throughout the process. The Wonga Park Advisory Group has been established to advise the Commissioners on issues which affect the Wonga Park area and transition to Manningham.

This update sheet will appear for the next few months to provide ongoing feedback about issues raised by the Wonga Park Advisory Group and the overall transition process. Any queries by Wonga Park residents can be directed to the Wonga Park Advisory Group or the Council on 9840 9230.

#### HOME CARE SERVICES

After a few initial hiccups with Home Care Services, which have been fixed, Manningham City Council is providing the same level of service to clients as was delivered by the Yarra Ranges Shire Council. An initial assessment by Council staff indicates that all is going well. Any queries about Home Care Services should be directed to Rosemary McCormack on 9840 9228.

#### **TIPPING ARRANGEMENTS**

The Manningham City Council wishes to advise all Wonga Park residents that all existing services will continue to be provided by the Shire of Yarra Ranges. Yarra Ranges is continuing to deliver services to Wonga Park on behalf of Manningham City Council. Initial enquires about waste management can be directed to the contractors, Cleanaway, or the Waste Management Unit of the Shire of Yarra Ranges.

#### ROADS

The upgrading of roads is undertaken on a needs basis, eg those in the worst condition or most dangerous, get priority attention. The traffic volume on a gravel road affects its condition and how often it needs attention. The Shire of Lilydale had set a level of service for grading roads in the Wonga Park area based on providing safe conditions for motorists and pedestrians. The City of Manningham will continue to maintain similar conditions.

The draft Road Management Strategy has been has recently been released for public comment.

#### FERAL CATS

There is currently no law which recognises feral cats. There is therefore, no mechanism to destroy or impound feral cats. The City of Manningham recommends that residents take the cat to the Cat Protection Society or alternatively, contact the Cat Protection Society to request that they collect the cat.

The number for the Cat Protection Society is 9434 7155.

The City of Manningham is currently reviewing local laws to ensure that community views are well represented. The draft local laws will be open for public comment in August 1995.

#### HORSE RIDING STRATEGY

In April 1992 a Horse Riding Strategy for the City of Doncaster Templestowe was completed. Implementation of the strategy includes an ongoing program which addresses the needs of the horse riding community. As the Strategy was developed prior the local government amalgamations it does not include the Wonga Park area.

In order to reflect the needs of Wonga Park residents, the Horse Riding Strategy will be reviewed.

#### WONGA PARK HERITAGE STUDY

The City of Manningham has appointed consultants to undertake the Stage One, Heritage Search of the Wonga Park Heritage Study. The principle consultant is Dr Carlotta Kellaway, a well known historian. Richard Peterson who is the Heritage Advisory to the City, will make a substantial contribution throughout the study.

The project will be overseen by the City of Manningham's Heritage Advisory Committee which has the Wonga Park community represented on it.

The project will undertake an 'initial survey of post contact site to produce a comprehensive list of places of possible heritage value as a basis for setting priorities for heritage research and assessment of significance'.

#### Wonga Park Heritage Study Community Workshop

A key component of the Heritage Search is finding out what knowledge the local community has about the area. Your information is important material for the study to cover as much ground as possible.

#### PLANNING SCHEME

The Upper Yarra Valley and Dandenong Ranges Authority which administered the Regional Strategy Plan covering Wonga Park has been wound up. Council has written to the Minister for Planning asking whether it would be preferable to have the provisions of the Strategy Plan incorporated into Manningham Planning Scheme. Council continue to be bound by the Regional Strategy Plan.

Work will commence on the consolidation of the Doncaster and Templestowe Planning Scheme and the Lilydale Planning Scheme, as it affects Wonga Park, into the Manningham Planning Scheme as soon as a response is received from the Minister.

#### **COMMUNITY SERVICES**

Wonga Park and District Residents Association have been given a grant from the Municipal Recreation Fund to conduct a Festival on the weekend of November 4 and 5, 1995. It will involve local business people, crafts people, youth groups and community organisations. It is anticipated that the festival will develop into an annual "Wonga Park Community Arts and Crafts Festival" and be self funding after this year through rental from stalls.
