"GOVERNMENT ROAD" CONSTRUCTION WILL NOW COST

Back in 1989 the previous State Government passed legislation which had the effect of *eliminating* what were commonly called GOVERNMENT ROADS. This means a big change for many Wonga Park residents who up to then considered that living on a Government road would protect them from road construction costs.

For a road to be constructed the abutting residents will now have to pay via a special rate. The City of Manningham has 23 kilometres of unmade 'Government Roads' mostly in Wonga Park and Warrandyte. However the City of Manningham has decided to ease the burden. If residents want their road made, Council will pay 50% next year but this figure will reduce 5% each year for the next 10 years from which point in time the full burden will fall on abutting land owners.

REGIONAL STRATEGY PLAN

As previously revealed in a previous News and Notes the Regional Strategy Plan will cease to apply to Wonga Park just as we feared. However, to preserve the status quo, at least for the short term, the City of Manningham has requested the Minister for Planning prepare an amendment to the Lillydale Planning Scheme (as it still covers most of Wonga Park) to incorporate the aims and objectives of the current Regional Strategy Plan.

Council will then prepare a Manningham Planning Scheme which will cover the entire municipality.

RATES

Council has confirmed the following rates for 1995/6:General rate:0.6479 cents in the dollarFarm Rate0.3887 cents in the dollarUrban Farm Rate0.3887 cents in the dollarResidential Use Rate0.4211 cents in the dollar

You can easily calculate your rate by multiplying the site value on your rate notice by the above figure. If the result is not at least 5% less than last year then the 5% less figure applies. However next year the actual rate will apply- no guaranteed 5% reduction.

Example Average one acre block Site Value \$160,000

Rates = 160,000 x 0.6479 = 103664 cents or \$1036.64

Last year's rate was \$1293.94 so this year's rate would be \$1036.64 (approx)).
