Alan Bickford built the Cottage in 1950 as his family residence

1987 An extension and renovation was completed to ensure the Cottage met the requirements for a 'public building'. In the same year a new logo was created

The need for proper childminding facilities was discussed and a voluntary roster was organised in 1983

Alan Bickford died in November 1983

In 1981 The fees were \$5.00 per term, no matter how many classes a person attended. Activities underway were a Youth Group (who also mowed the Cottage lawn), pottery, breadmaking, leadlighting, spinning and weaving, keep fit class and some 'one-off' and 'how to' classes such as Greek cooking

In 1978 the Cottage was purchased by Lillydale Shire Council as part of plans for a recreation reserve



The first qualified childcare centre co-ordinator was appointed in 2003 and everything temporarily moved to the Wonga Park hall while extension/renovations proceeded at Cottage

10 years since the Cottage started, in 1990, Linda Hay became the first paid co-ordinator after funding from Council was provided



With the amalgamation of local Councils, the Cottage became part of Manningham City Council in 1994

In 2004 The Cottage applied for A Manningham City Council Community Development Grant, to bring together intergeneration histories and stories from residents and record the outcome.

Talking History in Wonga Park project was completed and the Wonga Vine Newsletter distributed to the local community

Channel 31 came to do a 'House around the Corner' video special in 2012

Today, 27th November 2021, we celebrate local culture and history of the cottage at the Back to the Cottage event with the unveiling of an artwork by Janet Hayes

New guttering and downpipe installation threatened the climbing rose on the front porch in 2016. Thankfully our gardener was able to give it a prune. Unfortunately in 2020 this heritage rose was removed entirely

In 2008 Louise Schweiger was appointed as Assistant Co-ordinator
