A PICTORIAL HISTORY OF PARK ORCHARDS

Park Orchards Community House

A unique collection of early photographs, press clippings and original maps telling the story of Park Orchards from the time of the first Crown Allotments in 1854 to the eventual subdivision and settlement of the village we know today.

1951 - Park Orchards Golf Course 8th Green (Now 66 Ennismore Cr.) **Prior to 1850** this district which first became known as 'The Park' was a native bushland of wattles eucalypts and wildflowers, inhabited by Kangaroos, Echidnin's, Wombats, Bandicoots native birds and Possums.

The First Crown Allotments were purchased by C. Heape and F. McDonnell in 1854

In 1902 Tom Petty and his wife Eliza purchased 500 acres of land and after clearing, established 80 orchard blocks with 10 dams and rows of pine trees as wind breaks. These orchards were productive by 1906. E & M Gibb acquired this property in 1914 with W. Sell as caretaker.

By 1920 other orchards had been established and a small community resided in the locality. Some of the families living here were: Mitchell, Domeney, Brown, Milne, Zoch, Tortice, Sell, Coleman, Johansen, and Porter.

The Park Orchards Country Club Estate was launched in 1926 by Timber Merchants Sharp & Taylor when they purchased all of the Gibb & Sell land (this would eventually become the village of Park Orchards). Tuxon & Miller who had worked with Walter Burley Griffin surveyed the estate and subdivided most of it into half-acre blocks following the contours of the land.

The estate consisted of a Cricket Ground, Croquet Lawn, Tennis Courts, Swimming Pool and a Club Hall (Chalet).

A nine hole golf course was completed in 1931.

Gates were placed at the entrance, and a covenant was placed on the subdivision to maintain exclusive residential status.

At this time Sharp and Taylor cleared sections of the estate surrounding the Golf Course and planted **Pine Plantations**. These trees eventually self-seeded to produce the pines we see today.

In 1940 The Australian Army Signals requisitioned the Chalet and adjacent blocks for a Wireless Communications Centre. Power and water mains were brought in and 400 army personnel were housed in tents and huts. Large rhombic antennas were erected pointing to the pacific. The Chalet and Golf Course became temporary recreational facilities.

After the war the Army moved out and in **1947** Sharp & Taylor sold the estate land to **Edments**, a variety store **in Bourke Street** as a staff provident fund and recreation facility. **The Army sold the Chalet building** and six acres **to V.R. Jones** who opened a **Cabaret**. **The Edwards family** later purchased this and established the **Chalet Restaurant** we know today.

Over the next ten years the population of Park Orchards grew slowly. Some significant events were:

- 1958 Milk Bar was opened. 1958 Post Office was opened
- 1961 Park Orchards Primary School (P.O.P.S) was opened
- 1965 Council purchased **Domeney Reserve** and constructed a pavilion.
- 1966 Tennis Club was formed
- 1967 Park Orchards Ratepayers Association was formed
- 1969 A **private street scheme** was approved and constructed.
- 1962 **Bushfires** came through Warrandyte and swept through Park Orchards.
- 1978 Community House (P.O.L.T.A) established at POPS
- 1980 St Anne's Primary School opened.
- 1982 Community House property purchased by Council.
- 1968 Park Orchards Community House Inc. established

We have much to thank our far sighted early settlers for this unique environment of Park Orchards.

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
