

ADAM LINDSAY GORDON COTTAGE.

- Originally stood in the garden of Craig's Hotel
- Occupied by Gordon when he took over the Livery Stables in 1867 until 1888 when he left Ballarat following failure of the business and death of his daughter aged 11 months.
- Used as a sample room and fell into disrepair.
- Moved to Botanic Gardens in 1934,
- Restored, renovated and added to. Architects Clegg and Morrow, practical work D.S.Quayle.
- Money advanced by Crouch.
- Contained Gordon memorabilia, managed by Cottage Committee.
- Bust of Gordon unveiled 1941.
- Degeneration of Cottage and memorabilia due to lack of funds and lessening interest.
- 1990 Restored by Ballarat Y's Mens Club using apprentices and volunteer Master Builders with materials donated by local businesses.
- Memorabilia > Ballarat Turf Club and Gold museum.
- In 1992 became the home for the Ballarat Crafts Council.
