

VICTOR GREENHALGH

He was born in Ballarat in 1900.

He was educated in Ballarat ? where.

He was at the School of Mines until the 1st World War,

There is no record of him serving in the Forces (*that I could find, jg*)

After the war he returned to Ballarat at the Working Man's College.

He taught Art at the School of Mines in Ballarat and Bendigo.

He worked as a Sculptor and tutor and was the first President of the Victorian Sculptors Society in 1949.

He sculpted the heads of Whitlam, Holt, Gorton, McEwan, McMahan and Fraser in the Prime Ministers Avenue at the Ballarat Gardens, although the head of Fraser was returned after his death to his son and replaced with the present head by Nicholson

He has busts of Holt, Gorton, Menzies and McMahan in the National Gallery.

There is a picture of him modelling Holt in the National gallery

He has a bust of Menzies in Baroondara.

He sculpted the George Vth statue in Sturt St. Ballarat.

The University of Ballarat contains busts of Dick Richards and John Gorton, also a Centennial medal designed by him.

He retired to the Gold Coast.

There is a scholarship awarded at the RMIT.

He died in 1983..
