Two elderly religious men come on the scene - Goldber8 and Kaplan. They discuss the importance of religion. Baum decides to buy hisweekly lottery ticket with a twist to It. He wants. to share it with all the "Parliament" and whatever they win, they will divide equally. Everyone agreesandaticketisboughtwith ... thenumber231 811.

Ahmed Is sweeping the street when he Is confronted by his nephew Ibrahim who is being sou8ht by the pollcefor throwin8 home made bombsand being involved with activists. He wants Ahmed to hide him

Mr Salads sister Rachel comes along and tries to convince him that he should go and live in an old peoples home. Salad does not want to hear of this. Coincidently, Mrs Kogut Is being pressured by her son, the doctor, to retire to the same old peoples home.

Esther Baum and Mrs TZiphronl bring In a staggering Moshe Baum offthe street and it taices quite a long time to revive him and for him to announce that they have won a million on the lottery. Everyone Is ecstatic and Azoulal. the policeman, tries to calm them down. When he discovers thathe Is Included amongst the winners, hefalnts...

They all decide to 80 to the bank to collect; their winnings. However. Moshe Baum has misplaced the lottery ticket and everyone Is distraullht. Unexpectedly, Ahmed comes to the rescue. Whilst sweeping around the benches he came across the lottery ticket. His honesty is rewarded and he is made an equal partner, even though Eather Baum has something to say aboutthat

Mosne Baum announces that he has a wonderful Idea on how to spend the money. He has decided that a Yiddish theatre should be established for young people with himself as director and all his co-winners will have Jobs with in the theatre with no one having to go to an old people'shome.
