Mr. Berry then made his financial statement. He commenced by stating that it was only a few weeks since he took office, and referred to the difficulty of dealing with the question of finance in the middle of the session, and moreover met, as they were, with an acknowledged deficit of £200,000. He then referred at some length to the statements of his predecessors, with a view of showing that the whole revenue had been steadily increasing year by year, and that the expenditure had also become unnaturally inflated; but it was now necessary that they should look the expenditure fairly in the face, with a view to its reduction, and bringing it within natural limits. Although the admitted deficit amounted £200,000, that did not include all that they were behindhand, and he had included a further sum of £75,000 as an additional estimate; and this had, he believed, been brought about by a misconception, owing to a change in the mode of keeping the public account. It had also been found necessary to encroach on the trust




