BARBET PRODUCE MARKET.

A quiet week has been passed through in the produce market, deliveries, even for the off season being light. We have only heard of one small sale of local wheat, 40 bags being taken up at 3s 1/2 and per bushel, bags in. Flour has not moved a little, and is in good demand at our quotation. Coming to the rapid decline in the Melbourne market, consequent upon the improvement in the home crop prospects as reported in recent cablegrams, a sudden and decided fall has been experienced at Hertsford, where buyers are now offering 3s 6d per bushel. At Donalld the market has declined to 3s 7d per bushel, and at St. Arnaud 3s 8d is quoted. In this market there has been little doing in oats, and a decided advance in value is observed during the week at 3s 3d per bushel. Potatoes have been well supplied from Warrnambool, and are unchanged. Cheese is wanted and is firm, but both butter and eggs are very plentiful and easier in price. We quote— Wheat, to 3s 9d per bushel, bags in Oats, to 3s 8d per bushel, bags in Potatoes, to 13s 1/2 per bushel Beans, to 14s 1/2 per bushel Cape barley, to 10s 1/2 per bushel Peas, to 8s per bushel Rice, to 6s 6d per bushel Flour, to 15s 1/2 per ton Potatoes, Warrnambool, to 3s 5d per ton Potatoes, Hertsford, to 3s 1/2 per ton Hay, straight, to 22s per ton Hay, trussed, to 23s per ton Straw, to 20s per ton Chaff, to 7s 1/2 per cwt Onions, to 3s per cwt Carrots, to 2s per cwt Butter, fresh, to 8s 1/2 per pound Butter, salted, to 6s per pound Hams, to 11s per pound Bacon, to 9s per pound Cheese, to 7d per dozen.—Advertiser.

Cr Oddie rose to state— Cr Murray would first like to ask a question. Did Cr Oddie go to Mount Emu as a councillor or as private individual?

Cr Oddie said that was what he was going to explain. His business took him up to the mount, and Mr Wilson accompanied him. He did not go to make an inspection of a rabbit infested district, but to transact business. Mr Wilson asked him to have a look at the reserve, and he made personal observations—sometimes by himself at Mr Wilson's request, and sometimes with Mr Wilson. He did admit to Mr Wilson that the place seemed pretty clear, but also said it was the wrong time to judge whether rabbits were plentiful or not; and he also admitted that a lot of work had been done, but said that had the inspector not pushed Mr Wilson that work would not have been commenced. He would admit to the council that he only examined four places (Mr Wilson had said three), but the best time to see the actual state of

the place was either in the early morning

He thought the east riding should deal with the matter. Cr Russell—What will it cost? Mr McRae—About £400.

Cr Russell—There was no excuse why Mr Wilson should shelve this matter on the council. Cr Oddie at last meeting moved that the work of extermination be done in fourteen days or men would be put on. What was to be done with that motion?

Cr Cushing—The inspector stated that four men had been put on by Mr. Wilson to destroy the rabbits. They could not expect Mr. Wilson to plug the rocks.

Cr Murray—About three years ago when Mr. Wilson took the reserve on lease, there were no rabbits on it. Moreover, there was not the slightest likelihood of their breeding or living there. Mr. Wilson had neglected to kill them on his own land and they had been driven to the Mount so that now the place was over-run. I object to the Council plugging the rocks until Mr. Wilson's lease is up.

Cr Oddie said he didn't think the East Riding would spend £400 plugging the rocks.

Cr. Thomas again withdrew his motion.

Cr. Oddie moved that the rocks be fenced for half-a-mile with wire netting at the expense of the east riding.

Cr. Cushing seconded.

Cr. Russell opposed the motion, and said that as Mr. Wilson had taken over
