RIPONSHIRE COUNCIL.

THURSDAY, 2ND JULY, 1891. Present—Crs. Beggs (president), Lewis, Oddie, Austin, Russell, Cushing, Andrews, Murray, and B. Jones.

At the request of Cr. Cushing, who desired to leave by the 1.40 train, as he had received a telegram that his brother had died yesterday, the standing orders were suspended to allow Cr. Cushing to vote on the President's motion by notice, which was as follows:—

That in order more effectually to equalize the division of the funds in proportion to the necessities of each riding, the sum of £500 be transferred from the west riding to the north riding on 1st October 1891, and that a further sum of £400 per annum be so transferred on 1st October of each succeeding year, and that any and every resolution of the council existing to the contrary be and is hereby rescinded.

Cr. Beggs said he had brought the motion forward because he was satisfied the west riding could well afford to give the money to the north, which had so many works absolutely requiring doing on the roads, but which had to be put off from year to year.

Cr. Cushing said that the £400 per annum might be struck off. The President agreed to do so. Cr. Bridges seconded the motion, and said he would be perfectly satisfied to withdraw the motion of which he had given notice if this were carried.

Cr. Cushing was rather surprised at Cr. Murray's remarks. The records were taken from year to year the grants to the east would be found consistent.

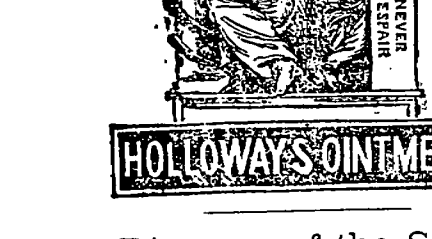

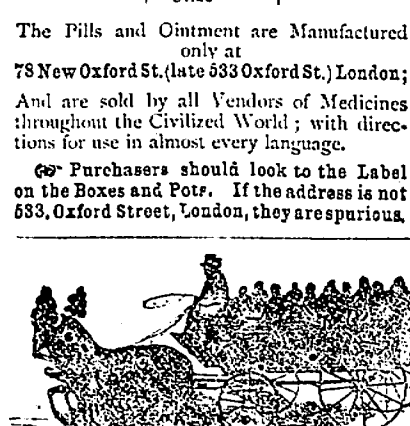
