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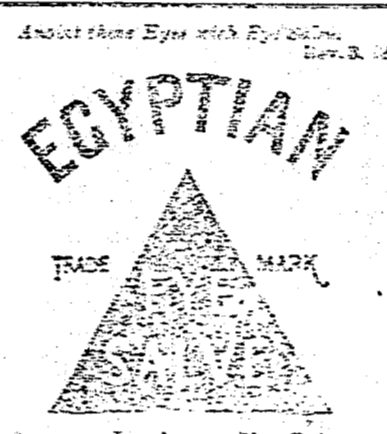

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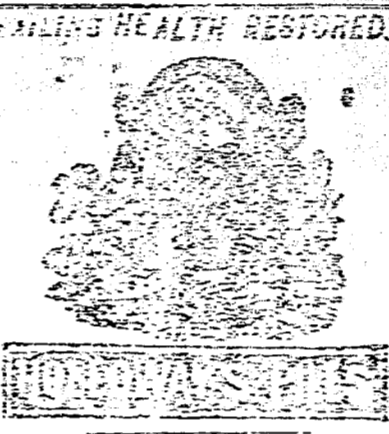

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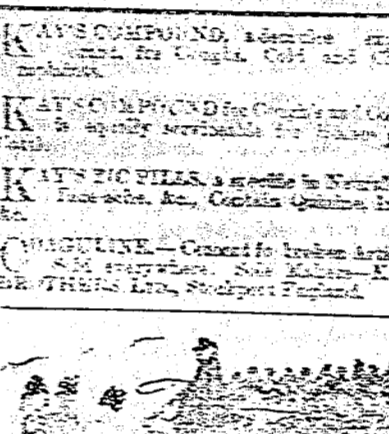

The latest developments in that concerning the fellmongering industry. An extraordinary railway accident happened on the G along and B line, a railway line on Saturday evening (says the "Argus"), the most remarkable feature about it being the miraculous escape of 14 passengers. The Balarat express, which left Melbourne at 4:25 p.m. on Saturday afternoon, ran into a goods train, which left Geelong about 4:30 p.m., about a mile and a half on the Geelong side of La Trobe. The goods train was travelling in the same direction as the express, when the collision took place, otherwise the result must have been most disastrous. Some 14 carriages of the express were filled with passengers, all of whom appear to have escaped with but slight injuries, and the guard of the goods train, who ran was considerably damaged, saw the express train rushing after him, and saved his life by jumping from the van to the ground. The express was travelling at the rate of about 40 miles an hour, and the goods train at 15 miles an hour, and it is an astonishing fact that while the latter left Melbourne at 4:30 p.m., it was not until 6:44 p.m. that the express left at 6:27 p.m., and to judge by the statements of the driver and fireman they had no idea that there was a goods train ahead of them. The damage done to the rolling stock of the goods train was very great, while the express appears to have been uninjured. The line was blocked off an early hour Sunday morning. Mr. Francis, the chairman of the acting commissioners, does not consider that the recent alterations made in the time-table on this line are to any extent blameable for the accident, which will be thoroughly investigated.

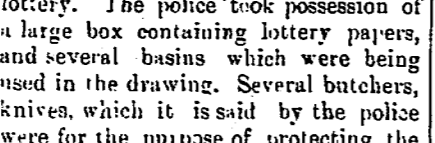
